Oregon Ruggers Face Barbarians

Oregon's Rugby Club opens its 1963 home schedule this Saturday against the powerful, touring West Vancouver Barbarians.

Game time for the contest is 1:30 on the varsity football practice field. There will be no admission charge.

OREGON'S young ruggers will be out to avenge a 5-3 loss to these same Barbarians last year. Noted for their aggressiveness, the Canadians are expected to provide some stiff competition for the Ducks.

Oregon is much improved over last year. With a stronger nucleus of players and a much larger for-

ward wall (averaging over 200 pounds a man), the Webfoots are regarded as one of this year's better west coast teams.

This is the second year that the University of Oregon Rugby Club has been in existence, but already the players have built a reputation as a team to watch.

LAST YEAR, in their first year of competition, the Oregon ruggers entered the Monterey Rugby Tournament, which is regarded as the west coast "championship meet." The young Webfoots staged a Cinderella campaign, and emerged with a fourth place trophy.

Returning to their winning ways, the team bounced a stubborn Oregon St. team, 9-5, in their initial game this season. That victory put Oregon one up on the Beavers in the best of three series which will decide ownership of the Devine Cup.

COACH JOHN Drinkwater, a young New Zealander who coached the University of British Columbia ruggers to an outstanding season last year, feels that the Oregon Club has made considerable improvement. The Kiwi mentor, who is studying for his Ph.D., credits Mickey Ordning and Barry Devine, presidents of the club for the past two years, with making this sport a success on this campus.

Outstanding players in the starting lineup will be Gordon Treble, Eric Lindler, Bill Delbiaggio, Wally Wolf, and Ordning.

AAU-USTFF Battling Again

The Amateur Athletic Union and the NCAA-sponsored United States Track and Field Federation are back fighting again after a recent truce that was set down by Gen. Douglas MacArthur.

The new controversy arose when the Big Six ruled that its athletes could not compete in any meet that wasn't sanctioned by the USTFF. This means that either the meets must be under dual sanction or just USTFF sanction.

The AAU claims that, according to AAU executive secretary Don Hull, "... there can be only one sanctioning body—and in this country it's the AAU."

This dispute means that the rivalry between the two organizations will probably have to go back to MacArthur for another attempt at arbitration.

Ducklings To Host Truax Hoopsters

Oregon's potent frosh basketball team, smarting from a two-point upset loss at the hands of Portland's yearling squad last weekend, will try to regain their winning ways tomorrow night when they encounter Truax Oil's AAU team.

COACH DON Kirsch's youngsters will be putting a 7-2 record on the line against the veteran Truax aggregation. Game time at McArthur Court is 8 p.m.

Truax fields a team made up primarily of ex-Oregon St. hoopsters. Top men on this year's squad are OSU grads Jim Woodland and Karl Anderson. Woodland is a left-shooting guard, and the 6'10" Anderson is a terror under the boards.

The high-scoring Ducklings (80.9 ppg and 105 points against Sweet Home AAU last weekend) will be out to complete a two game sweep over the Corvallis

squad. Oregon won an earlier contest by a 61-53 count.

JOHN FRANZ, 6'5" forward from North Eugene High, is doubtful starter for tomorrow's contest. Franz, a 1962 all-stater, has been ill, and missed practice Tuesday and Wednesday.

If Franz is unable to start, the opening lineup will probably include 6' Dave Kafoury and Rick Potter at guards, 6'9" Gene Brockmeyer at center, and 6'5" Bill Jennings and 6'3" Jim Barnett at forwards.

This line-up would see Barnett shifting from a guard, and the return to the lineup of Potter, who has been out with an injured knee.

Barnett leads the blistering Frosh attack statistically. The young Californian has flipped in 202 points in nine games, for 22.4 ppg average.
