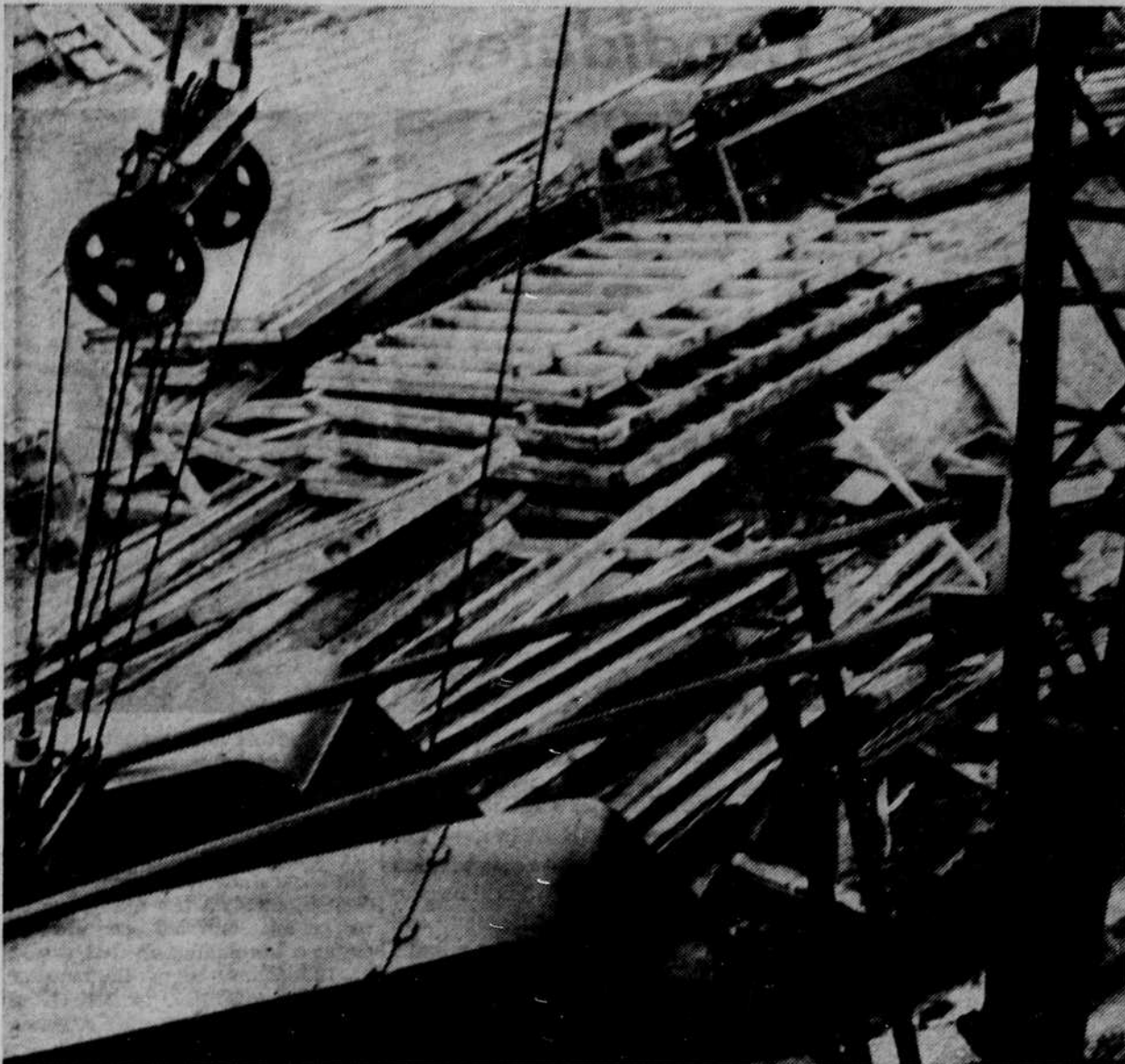




FORMS, MISCELLANEOUS lumber, and mud are framed by an idle crane in the center area of Dormitory no. 7, now under construction.
