

# Vertrees Leads Attack On Editor . . .

Buel said Thursday he has no intention of resigning.

Dennis Lynch, Senator-at-large, took the floor next.

"We have a publications board to handle this matter," he said. "I would be the first to admit that the Emerald has made mistakes this year, but he is the editor of the paper and it is his prerogative to act as such, and a political body has no right to cut him down," the senator-at-large continued.

Lynch said that for the Senate to ask Buel to resign would be to go against democratic principles of press freedom.

Vertrees said that he had gone before the publication board earlier in the year to ask that Buel not be re-named editor in January. He said that another senator had recently gone before the board to discuss irresponsibility in newspaper policy.

"Two faculty members heckled him consistently," the graduate representative said.

Art Erickson, ASUO vice president, appeared before the Student Publications Board Tuesday night.

Bruce Brothers, senator-at-large, asked Buel, who was sitting in the audience, to give his side of the story," he said.

THE EMERALD editor said that as an ex-senator he would ask the Senate two questions:

"One, do you really want a paper published without mistakes? If you do, you'll have the faculty putting it out. . . . Two, do you really want to decide what the views of the Oregon Daily Emerald should be?"

He charged that Vertrees was out of his field in discussing news coverage and editorial policy.

"As far as I can see this kind of argument is very petty," said Judy Wyers, married students' representative. She referred to Vertree's examples of alleged irresponsibility.

"THERE ARE other ways for the Senate to act in this matter," she said. "I'm sorry that the ASUO Senate is so responsive to the Emerald as a paper."

Brothers said that he did not believe that the Emerald editor could be expected to be responsible for every story printed in the paper because of the nature of the operation of the publication.

"Every time you read the Oregonian or the Register-Guard or any of the papers you see a box expressing regret at some error that has appeared," Brothers continued.

"I think the Senate can go at the editor in other ways," he said. Freshman class president Mike Salveson took the floor next.

"I wonder if we can expect the paper to have no mistakes if it has no cooperation on news," he

said.

"I happen to know that there was information on hazing withheld by an individual on the Senate," Salveson continued. "When he was asked why he did not give all the information he gave the personal reason that he would like to see the editor fry."

AFTER THE meeting Salveson refused to give the name of the Senator.

"I wouldn't like it in the paper," he said. When asked why, he said that it wouldn't do any good to name the individual.

Gordon Zimmerman, fraternity representative, said that the general principle to discuss was the damage Emerald publicity had done to the fraternity system.

"When a fraternity acts irresponsibly it is put on probation. When the Emerald editor or the paper acts irresponsibly some action also should be taken," he said.

"I DON'T THINK it is a question of censoring the editor," McCall said. "All we can do is make a recommendation."

"We want more responsibility in the Emerald's editorial policy," he declared.

Goldschmidt, who gave up the presiding chair to the vice president, said that the Senate should vote for the Vertrees motion only if it believes that it has the right to censor the press and only if the Senate really believes that the Emerald acted in an irresponsible manner."

"ASUO Graduate Senator Vertrees sat in my office and stated that he had information at his disposal about the hazing matter," Goldschmidt said. "As far as I know this information has not been made available."

"The Emerald did write one editorial that was out of line. They went a little too far a little too hurriedly, but they have admitted their error there," he said.

HE CLAIMED that the matter brought before the Senate by Vertrees was part of a personal vendetta.

"All of us has been subject to criticism in the Emerald this year. If we spent all our time worrying about what the Emerald says we'd never get anything else done," he continued. "I don't
