

Oregon Travels to Moscow To Seek Vandal Revenge

Oregon's Webfoots move to the Inland Empire for a two game rematch with the Idaho Vandals in Moscow. The Ducks shocked

everyone in the cage world last weekend when they upset the strong California Golden Bears 60-55. Although they suffered a 79-58 setback the following night, the Webfoots showed that they

can run with the best of them.

The Ducks and the Vandals clashed several weeks ago in Eugene's Mac Court, and the Vandals went home with two wins to their credit. In the opening encounter, the Webfoots fought the dangerous Vandals to a deadlock in regulation time, but let several golden opportunities slip by in the overtime period and came out on the short end of 62-61 score.

The following night the Webfoots went flatter than a pancake as the Vandals ran away from the Ducks in route to an easy 81-58 win. If the Webfoot's didn't learn anything else in the Idaho series they certainly learned that Gus Johnson, Idaho 6'6" center, is one of the best ever to perform in the Northwest.

Johnson put on quite a show for Oregon fans. He scored twenty points in the first game before fouling out, and the next night ripped the net for sixteen counters. In addition to his point production, Johnson was outstanding on defense, and his ball handling was more like a guard than a 6'6" giant.

Last Saturday night Johnson turned in a brilliant performance against Idaho State. He scored 37 points, a new school record, picked off 25 rebounds, got 12 assists, and blocked 15 shots. Quite an evening's work for a single man.

The Vandals presently boast the best record in the Northwest with a 13-3 mark. Until last weekend the Idaho cage crew was 12 and 2 with Johnson in the lineup, but Washington State turned the trick against the Vandals Friday night even though Johnson turned in a fine performance.

The Webfoots sent some California sunshine north Friday night in the form of a 60-55 upset win over the Cal Golden Bears. The Ducks were overpowered Saturday night by the potent Cal team, but the series marked the return to form of Webfoot forward Jerry Anderson.

Anderson, an off and on performer so far this season, found the range against Cal and scored 25 points in the two night Berkeley stand. The return of Anderson to form could be the badly needed support for the scoring attack of Glenn Moore and Steve Jones.

Oregon To Meet PSC Wrestlers

The University of Oregon wrestling squad travels to Portland to meet strong Portland State College at 8 o'clock tonight.

PSC has a 5-2 record going into the match and are the only team to defeat Oregon State. They have lost to Brigham Young, 15-9, and Washington, 16-10. The Ducks have lost to both teams, by identical scores of 15-9, and lost to Oregon State last week. Oregon's record for the season is 4-3.

Coach Mike Reuter feels the 157-lb. match between Doug Muck and PSC's Les Brown "is going to be a terrific match." Muck, the Oregon captain, has an undefeated record, marred only by a draw against OSU last week. Reuter said that Muck was leading in the match until he slipped off the mat and sprained his wrist.

Last year Brown defeated Muck in the coast tourney, but following the tourney Muck came down with infectious hepatitis. This year Muck defeated BYU's Joe

Lyman, while Brown lost to Lyman.

Probably the outstanding wrestler on the PSC squad, according to Reuter, is Len Pettyjohn. As a sophomore, Pettyjohn was coast champion in the 123-lb. division. Last year he was second in the 130-lb. division. He will be facing the Duck's Monrad Bjorge in the 137-lb. match tonight.

The traveling squad for Oregon will be:

Dennis Radford, 123 lbs.; Dave White, 130 lbs.; Bjorge, 137 lbs.; Charlie Warren, 147 lbs.; Muck, 157 lbs.; Bob Storlie, 167 lbs.; Bob Keeney, 177 lbs.; and Rick Burns, heavyweight.

Saturday the Frosh travel to Kelso, Washington to engage in a three-way meet with Kelso High School and the University of Washington Frosh. The Oregon Frosh are undefeated with a 6-0 record.

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
