## Cohen To Speak About Rhetoric

Herman Cohen, associate professor of speech, will discuss "The Freedom of Rhetoric and the Rhetoric of Freedom" at 4 p.m. Thursday in the Student Union.

"In the talk I will try to trace the relationship between rhetoric and freedom and indicate the role of the person in maintaining that relationship," Cohen said.

Cohen is currently serving as a member of the Editorial Board of the "Quarterly Journal of Speech" and of the Freedom of Speech Committee of the Speech Association of America. He is editor-elect of "Western Speech."

He came to the University in 1949 and served as Director of Forensics for some time.

He is an authority on Hugh Blair and 18th Century rhetoric, and he plans to continue his research in Scotland during the spring and summer terms of the 1964 academic year.

# UO Symphony To Play Tonight

The University of Oregon Symphony Orchestra with the University Trio as guest soloist will present a concert at 8:00 p.m. tonight.

The concert, which will be presented as part of the 1963 Festival of the Arts, will be presented in the auditorium of the School of Music, under the direction of George Boughton of the Music School faculty.

Among the selections on the program will be a performance of the rarely-played virtuoso Triple Concerto in C Minor for violin, cello, piano, and orchestra. This presentation will mark the debut of this particular Beethoven concerto in Eugene.

Members of the Trio are William Woods (piano), Lawrence Maves (violin), and Robert Hladky (cello).

Other selections are "The Symphony No. 31 in D Major" by Mozart. Also called "The Paris Symphony", it is the first Mozart symphony calling for the full classical orchestra.

The orchestra will also perform a set of "Eight Russian Folksongs" by Liadov and will conclude with a performance of "The Meister-singer Prelude" by Richard Wagner.

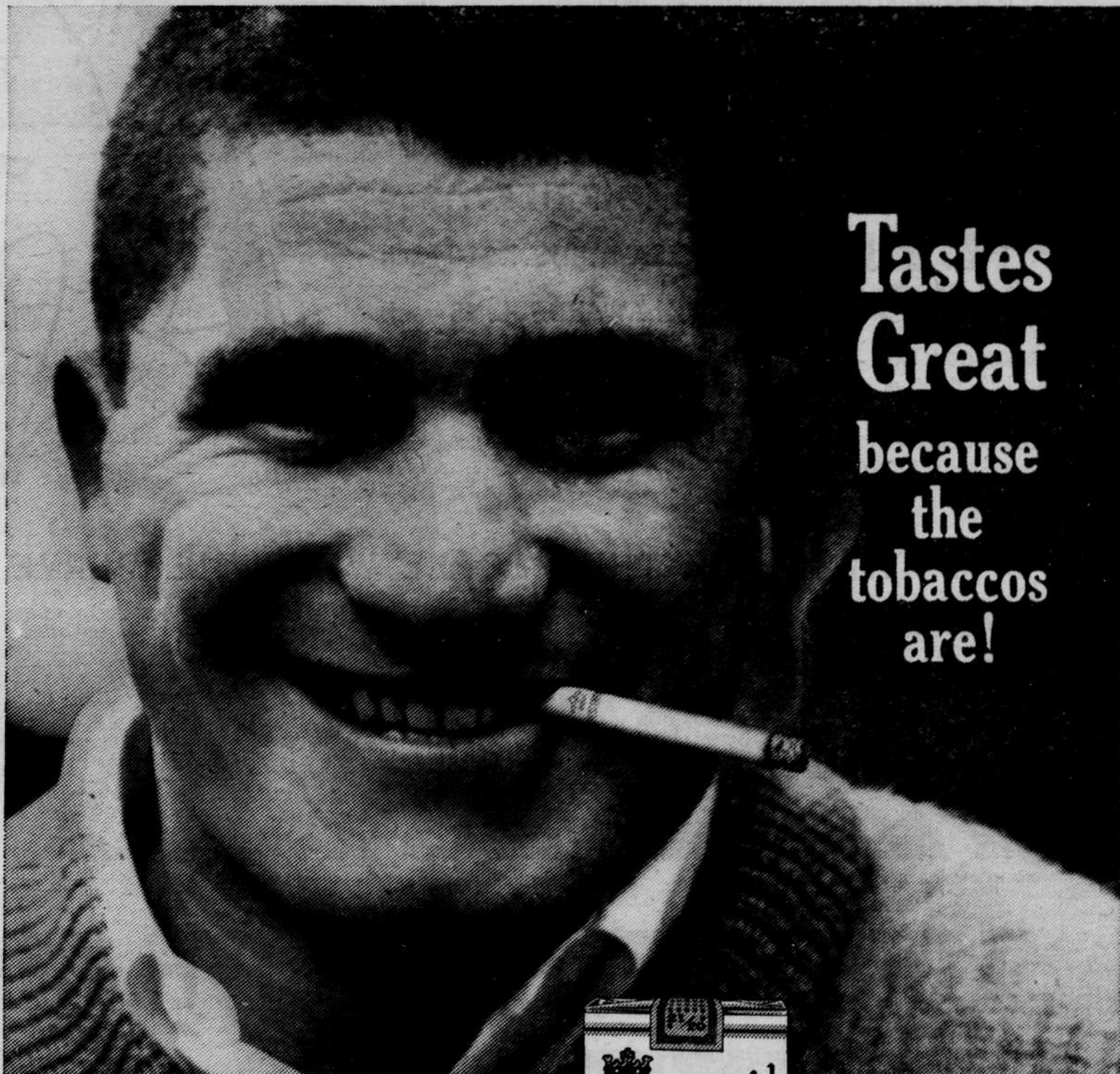

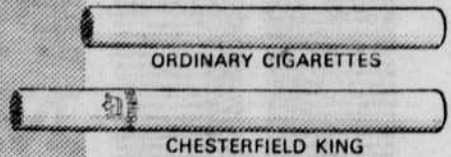
