The fast improving Oregon Webfoots will face the powerful Seattle Chieftains in a single game this weekend in Oregon's McArthur Court.

Already picked to play in the NCAA playoff tournament, the Chieftains have run up a 13-5 record thus far this season. In rolling to their impressive record, the Chiefs have racked up a 31.9 points per game average. The Chieftains are lead by All-American Eddie Miles.

MILES, a 6'4" senior guard, was a third team pick on the UPI All-American team. Miles known as "The Man with the Golden Arm" is leading the Chieftains with a 24.7 point average per game. Miles an outstanding player with Seattle for two years has been nothing short of phenomenal this year. The Seattle standout had his best night of the year against the University of Portland when he bagged 42 points as the Chiefs crushed the Pilots 102-72.

Although the Webfoots 11-12 record is a far cry from the 18-5 Seattle mark, the Ducks have been red hot in their last three ball games. In their last three encounters,

home court. Going into the Washington State series, the Webfoots were 1-7 on the Mac Court maples, beating only BYU in the season's second encounter. Against the Cougars, the Oregon five turned in their best offensive performance of the year in route to a 84-72 win.

The contest will set the stage for a rematch between the Chieftain's scoring ace, Eddie Miles, and John Mack, the Webfoot defensive specialist. Oregon fans will remember last years clash between the two stars when Mack put the damper on Miles' scoring touch holding him to only five points as the Ducks upset the Chieftains 71-65.

MACK HAS added another trick to his basketball bag of tricks with his current scoring spree. In the last two Webfoot outings, Mack has hit for 26 points almost as much as he had produced in his previous 18 games. Mack pumped in 15 counters against Washington State and turned in an 11 point performance against the University of Portland.

Joining Mack in the backcourt will be 6'3" sophomore Elliott Gleason. Gleason, a good pick for the Webfoot's most improved player, has added some badly needed scoring to the Duck attack. Gleason ripped the nets for 15 points against Washington State and hit for 12 counters against the University of Portland.

Webfoot front line duties will fall to 6'5" junior Steve Jones and 6'5" junior Jim Johnson at forwards, and 6'7" senior Glenn Moore at center. Ron Hanson, who came off the bench to hit four straight buckets just before the half ended against Portland, will be a good bet to see action Saturday night.

STEVE JONES still leads the Webfoot scoring attack. Although Jones has fallen off the pace in his last few games, he still boasts a 14.7 average. Glenn Moore holds down the second spot with a 13.8 average, and Jim Johnson isn't far behind with a 13.1 average.

In the last three Duck games, Johnson has been red hot. The junior forward has hit 24 of 41 from the field for a blistering .585 percentage. Johnson has been in double figures for the last three ball games, and topped his scoring assault with a 25 point production against Portland to give him a 21 point average for the last three contests.

MOORE IS close behind Johnson with a .520 percentage on 26 against Portland to give him a 21.3 point per game average. Moore dumped in 26 points in the first game of the Washington State series.

Steve Jones also leads the Ducks in the rebounding department with 338 grabs off the

boards.

The Chiefs will tackle the University of Portland Friday night before journeying to Eugene for the Saturday night encounter. Game time is set for 8 p.m. in McArthur Court.

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Delta Chi's Set Push
Cart Relays for Spring

Every campus living organization is urged to join the Delta Chi Annual Push Cart Relays to be held April 27.

What the . . . is a push cart?

A push cart is a metal construction similar to a soap box racer that has been stripped of its sides, and no more than 72-inches long and 48-inches high. It must be equipped with no more than four hard-rubber wheels.

Carl Finwall, director of the first push cart relays, said that he got the idea for the relays when he transferred to Oregon from San Jose State this year. According to Finwall the push cart relays at UCLA, San Jose, and California are similar to Oregon's Canoe Fete as a campus attraction.

All campus organizations and living groups are eligible to enter one push cart in the relays. Trophies will be awarded to the winners of first and second places in the men's and women's relays and to the organization with the most original pushcart.

The five relay "pushers" must be male students registered at the University and cannot be members of the frosh or varsity

track team or letterman.

The tentative race course will be along 13th, 14th and Kincaid Street. Finwall said that this course has already been cleared with city manager Hugh McKinley.

Immediately preceding the races, there will be a "fun parade" in which all organizations entering the races must participate. Any organization may enter the parade without participating in the push cart races.

There will be an entry fee for those organizations entering the races, with all profits going to the Pearl Buck School. No entry fee has been set yet.
