Sunday is a busy day. The SU movie features Marilyn Monroe and Don Murray in a comedy written by William Inge, "Bus Stop." This was the movie that helped further Miss Monroe's career as a film comedienne. It was also the basis of the now-defunct television show.

There will be a faculty recital at 4 p.m. in the School of Music Auditorium. The concert will feature Exine Anderson Bailey, soprano; William Woods, piano; George Boughton, violin; and John Hamilton, organ.

The Film Society is showing Jean Seberg and Jean-Paul Bel-mando in the French film (1961) "Breathless" which earned critic's raves. Cocteau and Sarte even declared it a masterpiece.

And there are more concerts during the week: Monday, there is a student recital at 8 p.m. in the School of Music auditorium; Tuesday, there is a choral concert, same time, same place; Wednesday, the Little Concert Series is presenting the New York Woodwind Concert at 8 p.m. in the Student Union.

Movies are greater than ever—at least they are worth two weeks running in the minds of some Eugene theatres. There shouldn't be any complaints, however. The quality of films is pretty good this weekend, even if they have been here before, or for awhile.

"Diamond Head" with its all-star cast of Charlton Heston, Yvette Mimieux, France Nuyen, James Darren and George Chakiris, is still showing at the Fox. Time had a good comment about this film. It said something to the effect that this was a film about racial prejudice but all the color

seemed to be Eastman Kodak.

The co-feature is a good adventure film (with a few moral points) about a Jewish girl who is trying to reach Israel. "Lisa" stars Stephen Boyd and Dolores Hart.

And Sunday, the Fox will be presenting "Billy Budd," a film that has won critic's raves. Based on the book by Herman Melville this film is concerned with good and evil and justice. Some have seen it as an agreement with Christianity; others as an attack. The production stars Robert Ryan, Terrance Stamp and Peter Ustinov who wrote and directed it too.

The Heilig is still showing "40 Pounds of Trouble" with Tony Curtis, Suzanne Pleshette and Phil Silvers. The best part is the chase scene in Disneyland.

The co-feature is an old western, "Winchester 73" with James Stewart, Shelly Winters and Rock Hudson.

The McKenzie is showing "The Manchurian Candidate," a satire on extreme rightism (of course those groups usually satirize themselves) with Frank Sinatra and Laurence Harvey starring. "War Hunt" with John Saxon is the co-feature.

The Mayflower has finally brought back "Viridiana," a Mexican film made last year. This is a horrifying story of the imperative conflict between an idealistic girl and the essential lust and cruelty of reality. This is certainly a must-see, particularly if you are a foreign film fan.

The McDonald is also showing another good movie—Simone Signoret and Laurence Olivier in "Term of Trial." Although critical opinion is divided, one cannot ignore the irony that Olivier faces as a school teacher who is accused of attacking a student. If he denies the charge he loses his wife; if he does not deny it, he loses his job and self-respect.

The co-feature is "Convicts 4" with Rod Steiger, and Vincent Price.
