ROTC Instructor To Train Civilians in South Viet Nam

Major Edward Zuver, assistant professor of military science at the University, will leave the campus on March 12 to join the Special Forces mission in South Viet Nam.

IN SOUTH Viet Nam Zuver will be involved in training the Vietnamese "irregular" forces. He will teach the civilians to defend themselves and their villages from the Viet Cong guerillas from North Viet Nam.

Before proceeding to Viet Nam, Zuver will take part in a three-stage course of instruction designed to prepare him for duty with the Military Advisory Assistance Group now operating in South Viet Nam.

HE WILL report to Fort Bragg in April to begin a four-week Special Staff Officer's Course, providing potential staff officers with a general orientation and over-all knowledge of the military situation in South Viet Nam and the Army's mission there.

The eight-week second stage of instruction is designed to train

the leaders who are currently on duty in and around the Southeast Asian trouble spot.

By late July Zuver will begin an eleven-week course of instruction in Vietnamese culture, history and language at the United States Army language school in Monterey, California. He will depart from there to Viet Nam, with arrival scheduled for late October.

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Spring Election Campaigns Set

Petitions for the spring election of the 1963-64 ASUO officers are due April 3.

Campaigning begins April 4 for primary election, and general election campaigning starts the 10th, with elections April 17.

Candidates for ASUO president and vice-president are required to have completed at least three terms at the University with a total of 110 credit hours.

Other offices open are presidents, vice-presidents, and representatives for each class; nine senators-at-large; upper class men's and women's representatives; and sorority, fraternity, co-op, off campus and married students representatives.

The primary elections will limit the number of candidates to 15 for the 9 senators-at-large and two for all other offices. Write-in candidates are acceptable only in the primaries. Final candidates for ASUO president are allotted \$199 expenses; vice-president, \$50; and

all others \$30. Each finalist will have a chance to make a 50 word statement to be printed in the Emerald.

All candidates and campaign managers will meet April 3; time and place will be posted at a later date.

Breen To Give Speech At Renaissance Meet

"Projects of the Renaissance Society of America" will be the theme of a speech by Quirinus Breen, professor of history, at the Pacific Northwest Renaissance Conference.

The conference will take place at Western Washington State College at Bellingham, Washington, today and Saturday. It meets annually to discuss Renaissance subject matters.

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
