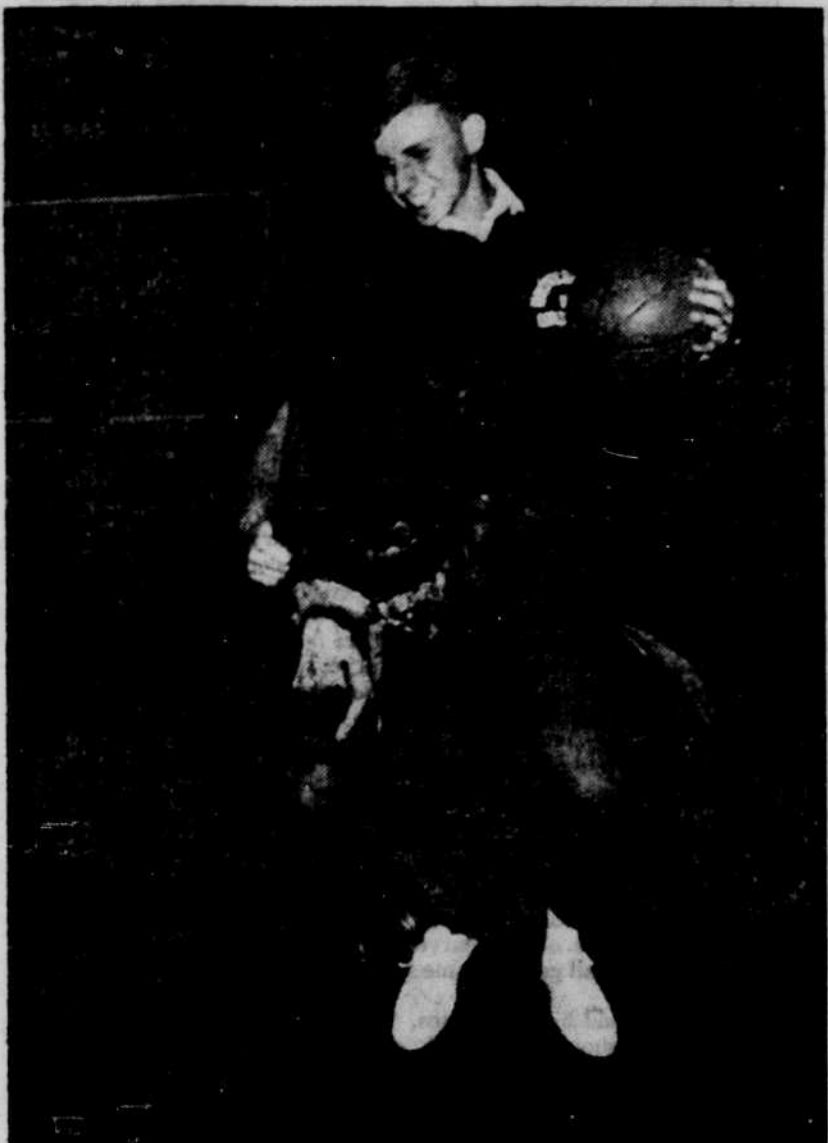

Goldschmidt, Buel To Resign
