

Number of Frosh On Pro Hasn't Increased Much

The number of freshmen receiving below a 2.0 has not increased markedly over last year according to figures released by the University President's office Monday.

In the fall term of 1961, 888 freshmen or 32 per cent received below a 2.0. This fall term, 872 freshmen or 33 per cent received below a 2.0.

In the winter term of 1962 678 freshmen or 29 per cent were below a 2.0. This last winter term, 625 freshmen or 28 per cent were below a 2.0.

A total of 343 freshmen have been disqualified this year. Comparable figures are not available by class from last year, although Clifford Constance, registrar, has indicated that this is an increase over last year's figures.

Prexy Supports HUAC Abolition

ASUO President Neil Goldschmidt issued a statement Monday regarding his position on the House Un-American Activities Committee resolution which will appear on the Wednesday general election ballot.

The referendum for campus voters states that "The ASUO hereby petitions the U.S. House of Representatives to abolish the House Un-American Activities Committee."

GOLDSCHMIDT said, "I agree with the resolution as stated that the committee ought to be abolished. I think that it is too easy to be against Communism and simultaneously destroy the liberties that our patriots accuse the Communists of subverting."

The HUAC resolution is sponsored by the ASUO President's Civil Rights Committee. The Committee was established last fall.

It is an experimental and exploratory project to increase student interest in civil liberties.

AS A PART of the campaign to stimulate debate and discussion on the HUAC controversy the ASUO committee sponsored two motion pictures Friday.

A CAPACITY crowd in 150 Science viewed "Operation Abolition" and "Operation Correction." The first is produced by the House Un-American Activities Committee the other by the American Civil Liberties Union of Northern California. Both were concerned with the May 1960 HUAC student demonstration in San Francisco.

Monday a debate was held between former Rep. Charles O. Porter, outspoken opponent of the committee and conservative spokesman Walter Huss. Huss is chairman of Portland's anti-communist Freedom Center.
