Baseball Nine Posts Victories Over Pilots

PORTLAND—Oregon's baseball nine posted wins number 15 and 16 Saturday by blanking the University of Portland, 4-0, in the opener and edging past the Pilots, 4-3, in nightcap action.

The Ducks return to league action today and Tuesday, as they host the Idaho Vandals for a single game each day, beginning at 3 p.m. Coach Don Kirsch plans to start Robbie Snow on the mound in today's contest.

THATCH McLEOD hurled six innings of the shutout, allowing only one hit in six innings as he picked up the win. The righthander, who hasn't given up a run in 16 innings, fanned nine batters while walking one. Reliever Wally Palmberg took over pitching duties in the last frame and gave up the second hit of the game.

Oregon opened its scoring in the first with a single run, racked up two more in the second and added an insurance run in the fifth.

CENTERFIELDER John Livingston paced the Ducks' nine-hit effort with three for four at the plate—two singles and a double. Adding triples to the attack were Rich DePew and Eric Hardin.

In the nightcap, Oregon drew first blood in the top of the first as Jeff Allen knocked in two runs with a single. The Pilots tallied in their half of the first and in the third to knot the score at 2-2.

The visitors jumped ahead again in the next frame only to have Portland tie the score, 3-3, going into the final inning.

PROVIDING THE winning run for the Ducks was Terry Leininger who drew a free pass, was sacrificed to second, advanced on a fielder's choice and stole home.

Credited with the victory was Lloyd Gallaher, who came in for starter Don Doerr in the fifth.

Ex-Webfoot Wins At Drake Relays

DES MOINES, IA. (AP) — Thanks to weather which ranged from bad to worse, Dyrol Burleson's birthday celebration was somewhat of a flop.

The former Oregon miler who turned 23 years old Saturday had hoped to run a fast mile at the Drake Relays.

BURLERSON USED a 56.6 second last lap to carry him from behind to a 4:05.4 win.

"I knew as soon as I saw the track that I wasn't going to run a great mile," Burleson said.

Rain poured down on the track turning the infield into a swamp. Burleson was covered with mud kicked up by pacesetter Pat McNeal of Kansas State.

Llewellyn, Moro Set Pace In 87-57 Track-Field Win

PULLMAN, WASH. — Even with four of their top performers competing at other meets, and injured, the Oregon Ducks easily defeated the Washington State Cougars 87-57 in a dual track meet here Saturday.

Half-miler Ray Van Asten and high-jumper Paul Stuber were at the Mt. San Antonio College relays while Oregon's top two javelin men, John Burns and Les Tipton, were sidelined with injuries.

With these four gone, Terry Llewellyn became the afternoon's star as the 5-8 Webfoot high-jumped 6-10 3/4. This broke the Rogers field record which was set by Oregon's Les Steers in 1941.

GERRY MORO bettered the school record as he soared 15-1/8 in the pole vault. Moro had to settle for second place, however, as the Cougars' Nels Siverson also cleared the same height, but had fewer misses. Marty Frank, the old record holder, was third as he cleared 14-5 3/4.

Dave Blunt of Oregon and Jim Allen of WSU were the double winners of the meet.

BLUNT WON the 100 in 9.8, and then came through with a victory in the 220 in the time of 21.5 which qualified him for the NCAA meet in June.

Allen stunned Oregon's Mel Renfro as he took both hurdle events. In the highs, Renfro crashed the third barrier and never could regain stride as Allen won in 14.5. Allen also took the intermediate hurdles in the time of 38.1.

Renfro came through with a good effort to win the broad jump. He was leading with a jump over 23 feet when Eilif Fredrickson of the Cougars hit 24-1 1/2. Renfro responded to the challenge and sailed 24-8 3/4 to win and record his best mark of the season.

THE WEBFOOTS' Dave Steen won the shot with a heave of 59-3 and in the process set meet and field records. Steen's toss was six feet further than runner-up Dick Brown's.

Other Oregon winners were: Gary Reddaway with a 215-6 throw in the javelin, filling in nicely for the injured Burns and Tipton.

Archie San Romani won the mile with a time of 4:17.4.

Vic Reeve in the two-mile with a time of 9:30.3. Reeve also was second in the mile, as he re-

turned to action for the first time since the USC meet.

Dick Brown in the discus with a heave of 154-1/2.

The Oregon 440 relay team composed of Dave Crowe, Jim Meinert, Renfro, and Blunt was clocked in 41.8, also setting new meet and field records.

THE MILE relay team of Keith Forman, Al O'Leary, Meinert, and San Romani, which was timed in 3:19.5.

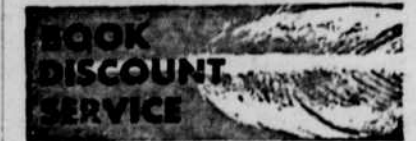
The Cougars got an outstanding performance from Fredrickson in the triple jump as he sailed 49-4 3/4 to better his own meet record which he set last year. Vern Fox of the Webfoots came through with a 45-10 effort which was good for second place.

Low Powell and Barry Adams of the Webfoots finished second

and third respectively to Cougar Jan Bentzon in the 880. Bentzon was clocked in 1:54.5.

John Chaplin won the 440 in 49.0, with Oregon's Meinert second in 49.2 and O'Leary third in 49.5.

AT THE Mt. San Antonio relays Ray Van Asten turned in his best 880 time of the year, only to place second to Jim Dupree. Van Asten's time was 1:49.9 as Dupree won in 1:49.4. Paul Stuber, the other Webfoot, failed to place in the high jump.



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
