

Guatemala Film Set for Tonight

James Metcalf, photographer and lecturer, will show his film on "Guatemala," country of contrasts, at the Film-Lecture series at 8 p.m. today.

The film will be in 150 Science. Admission is by season ticket or 50 cents for students and \$1 for adults.

METCALF'S film will depict the ancient civilization of the country contrasted with the world of today. Remote Indian villages, so far off the beaten path that the inhabitants see a white man only twice a year when the parish priest visits, were filmed.

Guatemala City is shown with ultramodern hotels and soaring skyscrapers contrasting with ancient Spanish churches. Contemporary businesses are seen side by side with the weaving trade which is centuries old.

Metcalf, who has been a professional photographer for almost 20 years, filmed Indians who are descendants of the Mayans. He filmed a live volcano and the mile-high lake, Atitlan.

THE FILM also shows a sequence of the archaeological work being done in the Peten jungle, where the Mayan civilization was originated.

Stereophonic recordings of native marimba provides the musical background of the color film.

Metcalf, who has taken pictures throughout the western hemisphere, is a graduate of the University of Michigan.

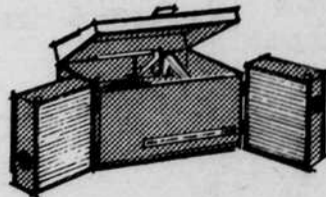
