

Berry Outshines Wildcats

Named Outstanding Lineman at Arizona

Oregon quarterback Bob Berry, labeled by his coach Len Casanova as a "tremendous team leader," has again proved his merit.

Berry, aided by Mel Renfro and an outstanding Webfoot line, led by end Dick Imwalle, paced Oregon to 28-12 victory over hosting Arizona Saturday.

Casanova expressed a "great deal of admiration" for Berry whom he felt was not only a good passer, completing 13 of 18, but a good signal caller and blocker as well.

Berry was named outstanding back of the game by the members of the press, while Imwalle earned honors as outstanding lineman.

Cas Praises Renfro

Casanova gave equal praise to Renfro who turned in his best offensive performance of the season. The All-American halfback carried 12 times for 113 yards, gained another 24 in pass receiving, and contributed one touchdown to the Ducks' efforts. In addition, he took over the signal calling duties for awhile and did what Casanova thought "a very good substituting job for Berry."

The Webfoots dominated the Wildcats both offensively and defensively. In total offense, they outgained their opponents by 190 yards, compiling 432 yards to Arizona's 242. Oregon's interior linemen gave Berry fine pass protection as he racked up 190 yards in the air to raise his season's total to 855 in five games. Last year, Berry totaled 995 in passing and needs 503 more to tie the record made by George Shaw in 1954.

The game had barely gotten under way before Oregon dented the scoreboard. Berry connected with Rich Schwab on a 19-yarder for the tally, capping off a 64-yard drive made in eight plays. The Ducks' talented kicker, Buck Corey booted over his first of four conversions to make it 7-0.

Ducks Make It 14-0

Berry guided a second quarter march of 75 yards down to the Wildcats' three yard line after which Renfro tallied, aided by Lu Bain's key block. Corey's PAT gave his mates a 14-0 lead at half-time.

Oregon opened the second half with a 65-yard scoring drive which was marred by penalties committed by both teams. The Ducks lost 45-yards on three penalties but gained some back when Arizona got the red flag twice. Another

Berry to Schwab pass, this time for 34 yards, put the ball on their opponents' one. Fullback Lu Bain then plunged over for the score.

Berry topped off the Webfoot efforts early in the final period when he tallied from a yard out. Oregon's second team had set up Berry's score with a drive from its own 48 before the starting eleven came in.

As in the past three games, Casanova used his entire squad. It was against his reserves that Arizona made its touchdowns. On the kickoff following their first score, the Wildcats surprised the visitors with an onside kick which they successfully recovered and then drove down for another TD. Both Arizona markers were made within the final four minutes of the game.

Oregon Coed Takes 1st In Javelin

University coed, Betty Ashlock, captured first place, Saturday, in the javelin with a toss of 95 ft.,

9 in. at the Emerald Empire Athletic Assn. track meet.

The only other University girl to place was Ellen Callaghan, who placed second in the javelin with a throw of 85 ft., 3 in. The meet, held at the Intramural Field, was attended by more than 50 girls, most of them high school and junior high school age.

Frosh Come From Behind To Edge Coubabes, 24-19

Oregon's Frosh footballers opened their collegiate careers on a successful note Saturday, as they came from behind to nip the WSU Coubabes, 24-19, at Pullman.

Tom Jernstedt's two-yard sneak with two minutes remaining in the game erased a 19-18 Coubabe lead and gave the Frosh their victory.

The Ducklings drew first blood in the contest. Doug Giles capped a 70-yard first quarter drive with a six yard plunge. The pass for the extra point failed.

The Coubabes came right back with a touchdown of their own, as Bobby Bates tallied from the three. The PAT gave WSU a 7-6 lead.

In the second quarter Murphy

scored again, this time on a 60-yard punt return.

With the score 13-6, the Ducklings stormed back with two touchdowns and took the lead at the half, 18-13. Bill O'Toole got the first TD on a six-yard run, and Tim Temple scored the other on a spectacular 70-yard punt return.

Both teams were held scoreless in the third period, but WSU took a 19-18 lead early in the final quarter as Bates scored from two yards out. With six minutes remaining, the Ducklings began the 65-yard drive that led to Jernstedt's decisive TD.

Frosh coach Ed Johns said he was especially pleased with Temple's performance, who, in addition to his 70-yard scoring romp, had a 90-yard run nullified by a penalty. Johns also singled out Jernstedt, end Steve Bunker and tackle Bob Lawrence as top performers.

The next game for the Frosh is the first of two "Little Civil War" games against OSU at Hayward Field, Friday.
