

Serves 30 Years for Murder, Still Claiming Innocence

SALEM (AP) — Dupree Poe, who continued to fight his murder conviction even after he was paroled, has been denied a hear-

ing by the U.S. Supreme Court. It was his 11th unsuccessful appeal in the past 15 years of his 31-year-old conviction for first degree murder.

Poe was convicted in 1932 of murdering a Marion County constable in Silverton.

After about 15 years in prison Poe took to the law books.

His self-drafted appeals included one where he claims to be a citizen of Communist China and demanded repatriation to his homeland, another, in which he claimed he was a Jew denied religious counsel and he also claimed to have invented a perpetual motion machine. Paroled last Au-

gust, he now is working as a warehouse clerk.

Poe said he still wanted a hearing, this time based on the contention that he had a new trial coming because prison officials denied him right to a speedy appeal of his conviction.

The attorney general's office said the appeal was denied on the grounds that Poe already had been given a fair trial.

6 Die in Store Blast

MARIETTA, Ga. (UPI) — At least six people died Thursday night when a blast ripped a crowded drugstore in this suburb of Atlanta.

Scores were injured and a fire captain says a seven-year-old boy is believed trapped in the rubble. He was shopping with his father when the blast occurred. The father was killed.

The explosion, apparently the result of an accumulation of gas, came as people jammed the area in anticipation of a Halloween parade.

Moon Over Moscow?

BUDAPEST, Hungary (AP) — The Hungarian news agency, MTI, said Thursday Valentina Tereshkova, 26, the first woman in space, will marry Andrian Nikolayev, 34, the third Soviet man in space, in Moscow soon.

"The wedding is to take place probably Saturday, Nov. 2, in one of Moscow's registrar offices," the paper said.

Rumors that they planned to wed have circulated ever since last June, when Miss Tereshkova came down from her 48 orbits in space.

4,000 Hear Muslim

BERKELEY (AP) — Malcolm X, leader in the Negro Black Muslim movement, told 4,000 University of California at Berkeley students Oct. 8 the parable of the "white fox in the North" and the "white wolf of the South."

The "white fox," he said, is a symbol of the "so-called white liberal who strangles Negro efforts by infiltrating our groups and posing as our friends."

At least, he said, the Negro knows where he stands with the "white wolf" of the South. Malcolm said the only way to avoid bloodshed in America's racial crisis is to establish a separate Negro nation—at the expense of the federal government.



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
