

Cambodians To Mark Tenth Anniversary

The University's eleven Cambodian students will celebrate their country's tenth year of independence Saturday.

The Cambodians plan a program at 3 p.m. in the SU in which they will dance the "ramvong," a circle dance, to recorded native music. A speech, designed to acquaint Americans with Cambodia, is also planned, and refreshments will be served.

Nine Teachers

Nine of the Cambodians who will present the ceremony are teachers in the United States for

a special study program. One of these teachers, Kim Sillon, who will be president of the ceremony Saturday, said he and his countrymen will wear national dress for the ceremony.

Cambodian men wear the sarong, women the "sompot" with a blouse. The sompot is a narrow skirt extending to wearer's ankles.

The only Cambodian woman on campus is Miss Oum Thoup Molyse Thourk, a primary teacher, who will take part in Saturday's ceremony.

1500 Year History

Cambodian history extends to the 5th Century A.D. The country was taken over in the 1850's by France. The capital city of the nation of 5,700,000 is Phnom Penh.

Those attending the ceremony will find the Cambodian language very similar in pronunciation to French.

Other details about the University's Cambodians: they greet each other with an enthusiastic "chomreap sour" (choom-re-up soor with the r's rolled and said quickly) at the same time holding their hands together in front of them as if in prayer. Cambodian names have their own intricacies too. The family name is first, the given name, last.

Judo Club practice will be held at 2 p.m. Saturday in the PE dept. wrestling room. Tournament plans will be discussed. Newcomer are welcome.



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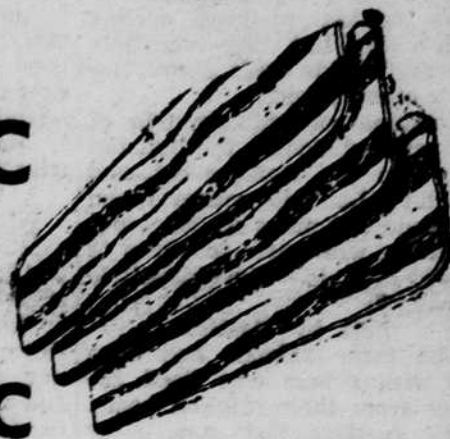
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
