

Ski School Will Open in January

A Ski School will open this winter by popular demand, co-sponsored by the Student Union Board and the Oregon Daily Emerald. It will be held on weekdays, beginning in January, at the Willamette Ski Area.

Two four-week sessions are planned, at a cost of \$20 each. Instruction will be \$12 and transportation \$8. Buses will leave from, and return to, the SU turnaround. Classes will have a maximum of 14 people and will be supervised by registered instructors.

Application forms are enclosed in today's Emerald and should be filled out immediately and returned to room 301 SU. Further information will be available in a special booth in the Ski Shop in the basement of the SU on Nov. 25, 26, 27 and Jan. 6, 7, 8, from 9 a.m. to 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.

Equipment rentals at special rates will be available at the Ski Area.

Orientation and movies will be held at Sheldon High School at 8 p.m. on Dec. 5, 12 and 19. Everyone is welcome.

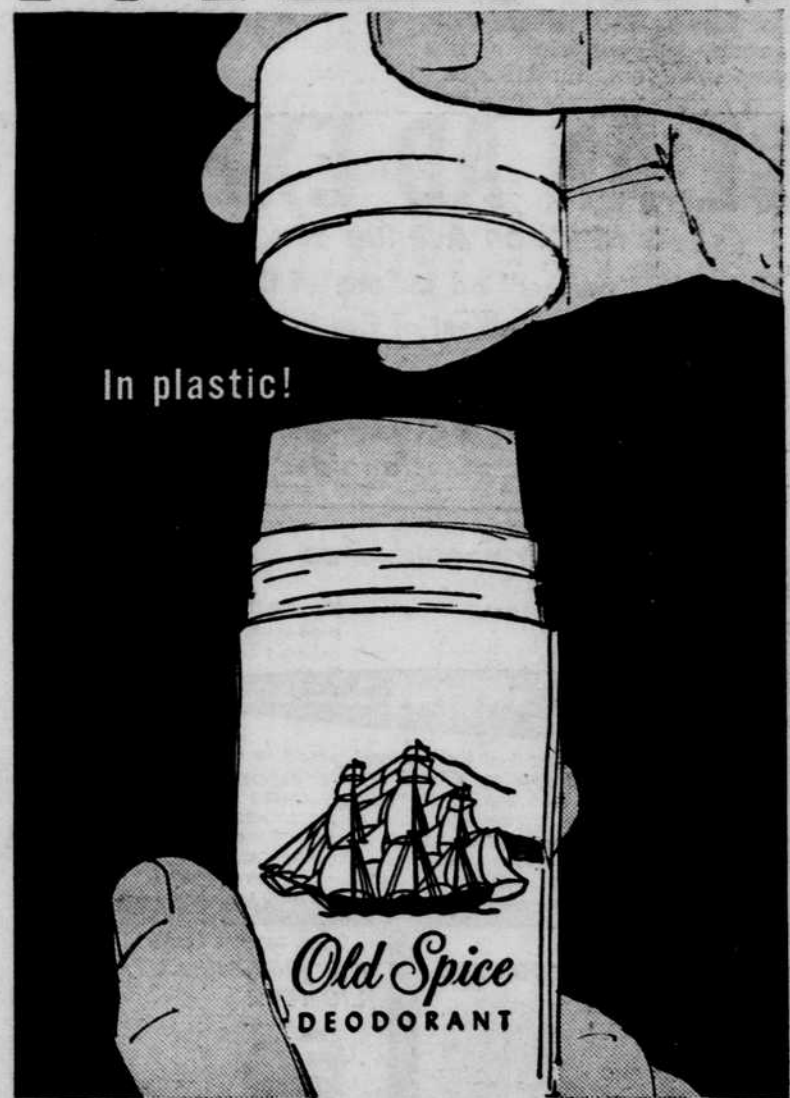
