Institute Plans Foreign Seminars

Three summer research training seminars in Mexico and Costa Rica for Oregon graduate students have been announced by John F. Gange, director of the University's Institute of International Studies and Overseas Administration.

The 1964 seminars are a continuation of the interdisciplinary seminars begun under the auspices of the Institute in the summer of 1962. The seminars receive financial support from the Carnegie Corporation of New York.

Sessions 12 Weeks

All three seminars will run for about 12 weeks. Students will register for graduate credit under the University's 11-week summer session program.

Fellowships are being offered for qualified students needing financial support for the summer. Applicants must be competent in Spanish and have previous study for Latin America, or intend to include such study in their future academic program.

Fellowships Offered

Fellowship awards will be made only to well qualified students who will be continuing graduate studies at the University or Oregon State University in the 1964-65 academic year.

One of the seminars will be in the states of Jalisco and Colima in Mexico under the direction of Samuel N. Dicken, professor of geography. This study of recent physical, social, and cultural changes in the area will be carried out by making a series of small area studies in different environments.

Plaxcala Study Set

A second seminar will conduct a study of Mexican culture in the valley of Tlaxcala under the direction of Dwight T. Wallace, assistant professor of anthropology

and Louis Breger, assistant professor of psychology.

This summer's research in Tlaxcala will consist of a survey project in archaeology, human ecology, social organization, and deviant behavior. Long-range plans in the area are for a study of culture in depth and through time, tracing the roots of the indigenous cultural heritage, and exploring the combination of indigenous and Spanish elements which has resulted in the unique, thoroughly Mexican blend of the present.

Plant Research Planned

The third seminar is a study of the process of plant domestication in Costa Rica under the direction of Carl Johannessen, assistant professor of geography.

The research will focus on the discovery of factors that modify the selection of reproductive material when cultivated varieties are planted. The economic and social consequences of plant domestication will also be studied.

Students interested in these summer projects should consult the faculty members in charge of the summer seminar most appropriate to their graduate program.

Applications Available

Applications for fellowships may be obtained from John Gange at the Institute office, 107 Commonwealth Hall, or from Gene Martin, chairman of the Latin American Studies Committee, 107-D, Condon Hall. Students should apply without delay, as funds are limited.

African Arts Topic of Talk

"African Arts and Crafts" will be the subject of a Browsing Room lecture Wednesday by Robert Ferens, associate professor of architecture.

At the talk Ferens will show color slides and play tape recordings assembled during his stay in Africa beginning in 1961 when he served as consulting engineer on the Volta Dam project for the Ghana government.

Following the talk a reception will be held for Ferens in the Museum of Art where his collection, "Arts and Crafts of West Africa," is on exhibition through Feb. 9.

Ferens obtained many of the items in his collection in West Africa, which, Ferens said, is the most important area for arts in all of Africa. Most of the collections consist of everyday articles which are interesting in design, and, Ferens added, very

difficult to acquire from the natives.

Discussion leader will be Vernon Dorjahn, associate professor of anthropology.
