 materials, would eventually overcome the opposition.

After six months of close observation, Worthy stated that he has scaled down hopes for his party. Faced with a shortage of trained people, the party will run candidates in only a few states, and will concentrate on educational improvements elsewhere.

Whites may eventually be admitted to the Freedom Now party, according to Worthy. He said he anticipates alteration in the original structure of the movement

to meet changing needs of a non-static future.

No Plans Now

At the present time there are no plans to admit other minority groups, such as Mexicans, Puerto Ricans or Orientals, because they have not recently voiced their discontent, Worthy remarked. He stressed, however, that all remain brothers in discrimination and exploitation.

Questioning the place of the Negro in American society, Worthy used as an example the incidents leading to his indictment in

1962 for entering the U.S. without a valid passport. He stated that people in power fear a dissenting voice explaining that he was not indicted until six months after he returned to Miami.

"It was significant, from their late action on indictment, that they wanted to see what I would do immediately after returning. Another curious fact is that the New Republic has reported that many travelers return to the U.S. without valid passports, and are not indicted," Worthy commented.
