

3 Matches In 2 Days

Matmen Await Weekend

Oregon wrestlers have a big weekend ahead of them—three matches in two days.

Friday night the Ducks take on the Washington Huskies at McArthur Court right after the basketball game with Gonzaga. Then Saturday at 2 p.m. they meet Portland State and that night the Webfoots are against California, again following the Gonzaga basketball game.

Last year against Washington the Webfoots came out on the short end of a 15-9 score. The Huskies have graduated Rich

Bell, two-time Coast champ at 177, but otherwise are just about the same. Reuter pointed out that Oregon is stronger this year.

The Oregon coach looks for a real close and tough match with Washington. The Huskies have three real good men, said Reuter. In the 123-pound class P. G. Phillips is a better than average wrestler.

Dick Wooding, at 137, is also one of the better Washington matmen. He holds a 2-1 career mark against Webfoot Monrad Bjorge, whom he will face in Friday's match.

In the 157-pound match the Huskies have Ron Johnson.

Portland State is not as strong as they have been in the past, said Reuter.

During the last few years they have always been one of the outstanding teams on the Coast.

This year they have lost to Cal Poly, 16-12, a team that the Ducks beat, 19-8.

Could Be Close

Portland State has some good wrestlers who could make the match real close. At 157 pounds they have Les Brown. Brown tied Oregon's Doug Muck last year.

A penalty point gave Ron Dexter a 6-5 win over Charlie Warren last year. Another good Viking is Ron Calhoun who will wrestle at either 130 or 137.

Reuter said that he didn't know too much about California. He had not been able to obtain any information about the Bears. The last two years the Ducks have won 30-0 against the Californians and have never lost a match to them.

For Oregon Hiro Hokkyo will lead off in the 123-pound class. Hokkyo, a black belt in judo, is relatively inexperienced in wrestling, but he is learning. His two wins this year were by falls.

Robertson at 130

At 130 pounds Doug Robertson will start for the Ducks. Robertson, a sophomore, has a 4-3-1 record. At 137 Bjorge is set for the Webfoots. Bjorge, hampered by an injury most of the season, has an 0-2 record.

Charlie Warren will set his 6-2 record on the line against tough opposition. Warren was fourth on the Coast last year. Muck also will face outstanding opponents in the 157 class. He has a 5-1 record.

Sophomore Bob Mitchell will wrestle at 167. He has a 7-1 record.

Glenn at 177

In the 177-pound class the Ducks have Bruce Glenn. Glenn, out of school last year, won the national AAU 171-pound championship. He has a 7-1 record this year.

In the heavyweight class the Ducks have Bob Keeney. Keeney, also with a 7-1 record, was Coast champ at 177 last year.

The Frosh have two meets scheduled this weekend. Friday they meet Clark College in Vancouver, Wash. Saturday they take on Multnomah Athletic Club at 1 p.m., just before the varsity match.

Oregon Bowlers Seek Region Championship

Oregon's varsity bowlers will be defending their Region 11 championship this weekend, as tournament competition gets under way in Corvallis today.

Other Oregon teams entering the tourney, which is sponsored by the Association of College Unions, will be women's bowling, bridge, chess, pocket billiards, three-cushion billiards and table tennis.

Both the men and women bowlers will roll their nine games today, while the other teams will see action on Friday. They will be competing against colleges from California, Washington, Idaho, Montana and Oregon.

Lou Bellissimo's varsity bowlers—Bill Starnes, Dennis Murphy, Andy Smith, Ron Babjar and Jim Bradbury—will be looking for their ninth regional championship in the past 12 years. Last year at Berkeley, they took top honors in the team event, while Bradbury and Starnes finished second in doubles, and Murphy grabbed second in singles.

In addition, the trio copped second, third and fifth in all-events (total pins for nine games). The top five bowlers in the tourney are sent to the nationals, but the ruling that allows only one bowler from each school to go prevented Starnes and Murphy from making the trip to Buffalo, New York.

Of the 20 men's teams entered, Bellissimo figures UCLA to be Oregon's toughest competition. He also expects Washington, Stanford and Cal to send strong squads.

Bowling for Oregon's women's team, coached by Miss Corlee Munson, will be Pat Johnson, Mariann Furrer, Betty Peary, Dee Golick and Janet O'Dell.

They will be competing against

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girls from nine other colleges. Last year at Berkeley, Mrs. Peary and her partner placed third in doubles action.

Other Oregon participants include Jeff Taylor and Dale Forster, bridge; Stewart Meyers and Robert Adams, chess; Gail Gribkov and Edwin Kam, pocket billiards; Walt Baumann, three-cushion billiards; and Yu Lee Lee and Paul Roos, table tennis.



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Ruggers Slate Washington Trip

A winless record and a sophomore-studded team travel to the state of Washington today to try to get the Oregon ruggers on the winning track.

The team is in Bellingham today for a game with Western Washington. Saturday it travels to Seattle for a league game with Washington.

Refsnider Wrecks UO Rifle Record

Oregon rifle team member John Refsnider broke the school record by hitting 197 out of 200 targets in competition with the Junction City Rifle Club Tuesday, although his mates lost the match to their hosts.

He had a perfect score in three of the four shooting positions—prone, kneeling and standing. His three misses came in the sitting position. His 50 for 50 score standing was also a record. The old mark was 195 by Ben Kahalekuler in 1957.

And Refsnider almost didn't win, despite his record. Eldon Powell of Junction City had Refsnider beaten sitting until he missed three of his last four shots.

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
