Other highlight events will be the 200-yard butterfly, the 50 freestyle, 200 backstroke, 200 breaststroke, 200 freestyle, and the 200 individual medley.

The meet prelims will start at 1 p.m. and the finals at 7:30 p.m. The meet continues through Saturday. The charge for prelims and finals is 50 cents for students and a dollar for adults.

# Webfoots Test Montana

It takes a loss to Portland to snap the Oregon Ducks back to reality.

Early in January the Ducks lost a squeaker to the Pilots in Portland. Both teams threw the ball around crazily. Tuesday night the Ducks again were lured into playing the Pilots' type of basketball and were nailed with an 88-80 loss.

After the earlier loss, Duck Coach Steve Belko installed a disciplined offense and Oregon knocked off nationally ranked Oregon State. It looks like it's back to a more determined, ball-control type of offense again for Oregon, this weekend against Montana.

### More Ball Control

"I think we'll probably play more ball control this week," said Belko.

"We were looking for the first open shot," against Portland, he said. "We can't throw the ball up there like we did against Gonzaga."

Belko also cited the inability to score on the fast break as a contributing factor to the Oregon loss. "We threw the ball

away on the break too much," he said.

Another thing that didn't help the Ducks was Steve Jones' inability to hit the way he has all year.

Belko said Jones has had his problems in the last four games—not only against Portland. And Belko doesn't know what it is. For the Ducks to win consistently, Jones must score consistently, since most of the Ducks' plays are geared for his outside jump shot.

### Atrocious Record

This week end it's the Montana Grizzlies from the Big Sky Conference. Last year the Grizzlies had an atrocious record—6-18. This year, though, accord-

ing to Belko, they have been playing good ball.

Gonzaga Coach Hank Anderson said the Ducks won't have any trouble with Montana. He said the Grizzlies are about the same height as Oregon and his Bulldogs beat them quite handily.

Belko gave his charges a night off on Wednesday. "The Gonzaga series might have taken a lot out of them," he said. "They might be leg-weary."

One person who might not be leg-weary but is having leg problems is guard Jim Barnett. Barnett, who bruised his knee against Idaho, limped off the floor against Portland with a reoccurrence of the injury.
