An athletic meet, a lecture, a conference, and a ragtime music show all are among the entertainment being offered this weekend.

Skiers and non-skiers alike may flock to the Winter Carnival, being held in Bend today through Sunday. For only eight dollars one can get three days of skiing, a folk song concert, and a talent show. Tickets are still on sale at the Student Union main desk.

main desk and Mattox Pipe Shop, are \$1 each.

Morath is one of the few remaining exponents of ragtime music, which is now an almost-lost art.

The University will also host two major events this weekend. The annual Oregon Press Conference will be held in the Student Union today and Saturday, and will be attended by leading journalists from both Oregon and the nation.

AAA Students Get Scholarships

Seven students in the School of Architecture and Allied Arts have been awarded scholarships and grants from various funds totaling \$1,200.

Grants of \$110 each from the Ina McClung Fund went to Dennis C. Canoy and Robert L. Moody.

Raymond Boucher received a \$100 grant for this term and \$100 for spring term from the Ellen M. Pennell Fund.

The Women's Architectural League of Portland awarded \$100 for winter term and \$100 for spring term to Martin Davis and Dennis McLaughlin.

Robert Gardner and Douglas Wolfe received \$100 each for this term and \$100 for spring term from the Tile Council of America.
