

# UO Faces Spoiler Idaho

Oregon is all alone atop the Northern Division.

The Ducks were tied for first with Oregon State until Idaho dropped the Beavers, 2-1, Monday.

Now it's just Oregon.

There's a hitch, though. The Ducks must also face Idaho here in a two-game series today and Thursday.

And the Vandals are tough. Do not confuse them with the weak groups often fielded by the Moscow school in other sports. These Vandals could still win the Northern Division.

They make their next big bid

for the ND lead here today when they meet the present leaders. It should be a whale of a ball game.

Throwing for Oregon will be Robbie Snow, the guy Don Kirsch likes to start in the first game of a big series. Snow also opened the Beaver series two weeks ago.

Says Kirsch of his ace hurler: "I hope he can have a better day than he's been having. He's about due for a real good game — I hope he gets it today."

The Vandals also boast Jeff McQueeney, a catcher who Kirsch says is "a good hitter and a good defensive player." Idaho also has a good shortstop in Dave Thomas.

But the Vandals lack good hitting. They're fourth in the five-team ND. Oregon is second. Kirsch says he isn't sure how to rate them as a hitting team be-

cause the statistics cover so few games.

Besides it's winning that counts in baseball and the Vandals are winners. They have lost only three games, although two of those were in league play.

Kirsch had one other comment on Idaho: "they like to run the basepaths," he said.

Meanwhile Oregon's forces returned to full health now that second string catcher Dennis McCarter is over the measles. That had Kirsch a little worried.

"If Jenson (first team catcher, Ken) had gotten hurt our manager would have had to catch," he said.

## Spring Football Prospects

# Matson, Dean Best at Tackle

This is the second in a series of seven articles on Oregon's spring football prospects.

Three lettermen, three non-lettermen, three freshmen, and a junior college transfer are Oregon's top tackle candidates at a position that looks like one of the Ducks' strongest.

The three lettermen are part-time starters Lowell Dean and Pat Matson and Dennis Maloney, who lettered but didn't play too much last season.

The three non-lettermen are led by redshirt Larry Inman, a JC transfer of two years ago who has been on the second unit and who line coach Jerry Frei says "looks like a real fine defensive player."

Dan Archer is teamed with Inman on the second unit. The third non-letterman, Jerry Lee, has been out of action with the measles.

Larry Kanzler, one of the top three freshman prospects, also lost practice time because of the measles. Roche calls the other two standouts, Rance Soppo and Bob Lawrence, both "good, young tackles."

The Ducks also picked up a

junior college standout in 225 pound Roger Stahlhut of Fullerton JC. Stahlhut has just started to look good in recent practices and Roche now thinks that he may add to Oregon's depth at this position.

But most of Oregon's tackle hopes revolve around Dean and Matson, who put in more minutes last fall than any other linemen except Oliver McKinney.

Dean has two letters. He earned most of his minutes last year taking over for injured Milt Kanehe late in the season.

Matson also came into his own late in the fall, mostly on defense. So far both he and Dean have been going both ways in spring practice. Both weigh 235 but Dean is 6-3 to Matson's 5-11.

The general outlook at tackle seems to be good. After quarterback, center and linebacker, it seems to be the strongest and deepest position on the Oregon squad.
