

'I Kept Seeing 15-14 Score,' Says Cas

"We've had too many of them up there," Oregon football coach Len Casanova told Monday's meeting of the Oregon Club.

He was referring to last Saturday's squeaker at Moscow where the Ducks edged Idaho, 14-8.

Casanova thought the Ducks were on their way after they scored easily the first two times they had the ball. But then a couple of mistakes plus an injury to Bob Berry kept the Webfoots from scoring the rest of the game.

Casanova said Berry's injury forced the Ducks to limit their offense. Oregon's star quarterback wasn't supposed to run or block if possible, said Casanova. "That kind of limits your offense," he added.

Casanova said that Idaho coach Dee Andros changed his defenses accordingly. In the second half the Vandals severely limited Oregon's offense and caught fire themselves. "I kept seeing a 15-14 score," said Cas.

Offense Went Well

"In the first quarter our offense operated as well as it has all season," said Casanova. Oregon's defense held the Vandals to just 44 yards in the first half. "I don't know what happened the second half," he said.

"We weren't going at them as quick and as hard," he commented. "I really didn't know what to say to them at halftime, we were playing so well. Idaho

showed us nothing different than we had anticipated on both offense and defense."

Casanova described Idaho as a good ball club, "a solid ball club." They were bent on rushing Berry as hard as they could, he said.

Casanova was very pleased with Berry's efforts against the Vandals. "He completed 11 of his first 12 passes," said Cas.

On offense Casanova handed out praise to fullback Dick Winn and guard Dale Wilson.

Defensive Backs Excel

Oregon's three defensive halfbacks, Ron Martin, Les Palm and Tim Temple, also were praised. Linebackers Harry Cartales and Tim Casey, end Oliver McKinney and tackle Jim Kollmann were also complimented by Casanova.

On Berry's injury, Casanova said he still isn't sure about Berry's condition. "He was running Sunday and it didn't bother him as much as I expected it to," said

Casanova.

Jerry Parsons has a bad sprain and probably won't play this weekend.

Of Ray McDonald, Idaho's super-sophomore, Casanova said, "He's a fine looking animal. He is a tremendous threat and has the speed to break away. He just bowls people over. He's going to get in some people's hair."

Haskins Praised

Casanova commented on the Vandals' success with the option run. He complimented end Rob Haskins for doing his job going after the pitchout man. "Our inside men weren't getting to their quarterback (Mike Monahan)," Cas added.

On the attempted onside kick-off that Oregon got, Casanova said that the Vandals didn't give Oregon receivers a chance to catch the ball, which is illegal.

Idaho had just scored and tried the onside kick hoping to get the

ball and a chance to go ahead. They kicked the ball short in the air. Oregon's Lowell Dean signaled for a fair catch and one of the Vandals grabbed the ball without giving Dean a chance to catch it. This was illegal and the officials gave the Webfoots the ball.

Top Offensive Effort

Renfro, Wilcox, James Star for Pro Grid Teams

Dave Wilcox, former Oregon star, again stood out on defense for the San Francisco 49'ers Saturday.

Although the SF club dropped a 24-14 decision to the Green Bay Packers, Wilcox was a standout on defense from his left cornerback post.

Wilcox recovered a Packer fumble and returned it six yards to his own 31 only to have his mates lose the ball as quarterback John Brodie was attempting to pass, setting up the last Green Bay touchdown.

In the third quarter Wilcox stalled a Packer drive as he tackled halfback Tom Moore in the open field and made them settle for a three pointer by Paul Hornung.

Mel Renfro, one of Oregon's all-time greats, played his usually fine defensive game for the Dallas Cowboys as they tied the New York Giants 13-13.

His most notable contributions included:

- Three punt returns for a total of 19 yards.
- Intercepted a Giant pass.
- Standout defensively in the Cowboy secondary.

Another former Oregon star, Dick James, now playing with the New York Giants as an offensive halfback, caught a pass for 12 yards and ran for an additional total of 21 yards on the ground as the Giants tied the Dallas Cowboys 13-13 in their Sunday encounter.

The Dallas Cowboys lost the services of Mike Gaechter, a former UO footballer and thinclad,

as he sustained a broken elbow. Gaechter will be out of the Dallas defensive backfield for several weeks.

Steve Barnett and Riley Matson, two former Oregon line stalwarts, are currently playing with the Washington Redskins in the NFL. Just recently Barnett beat out his buddy Matson for the starting assignment on the 'Skins forward line.

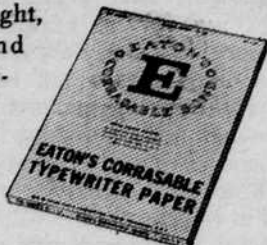
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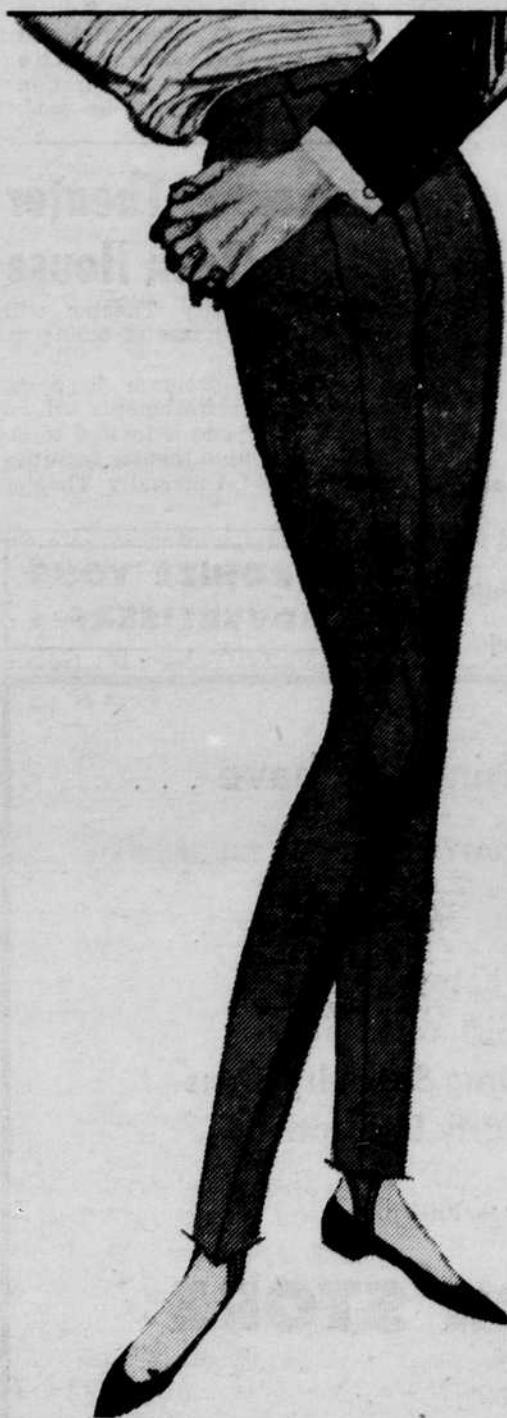
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
