

Civil War Game Wager Made by ASUO Prexy

If all goes well, the student body president of Oregon State University will be giving a concert of sorts in the Student Union in a couple of weeks.

Garbed in the Halloween-colored football uniform of his school, he'll give a rendition of "Mighty Oregon," University fight song—as long as the University comes out on top in the Duck-Beaver battle Nov. 21.

Otherwise ASUO President John Luvaas will be wearing the yellow and green and singing Oregon State's fight song at the OSU student center.

Luvaas and Jud Blakely, OSU student body president, made a wager Thursday via telephone on the results of the Oregon-Oregon State football game, agreeing that the losing school's student body president will appear at the first Friday at Four of the opposing school to sing its fight song.

With the losing student body president will go the student union board chairman of his school and his two secretaries—though it's likely that the secre-

taries won't be required to don football uniforms.

SU Board chairman at the University is Paul Moore, and the two secretaries are Judy Erland and Sherry Pitzer.

Student Officer Fined at OSU

ASOSU President Jud Blakely was one of three Oregon State students who were fined \$15 apiece Friday for burning without a permit. They were arrested at 8:30 a.m. last Thursday after burning the Rook Bonfire.

Blakely, Daniel Clark Kline, and David Terrence Doherty were sentenced by Judge Helmut Schreima.

The original charge, "Maliciously and willingly starting a fire" was dropped because the judge could not find it in the law book. Instead the boys were fined for "burning without a permit."

When asked how they wished to plead, the boys, who had chosen to appear without legal aid, chose guilty. Blakely wished to make an explanation but was never heard. Schreima made it very clear that all he wanted to know was whether or not the boys had a permit. They did not.

After being fined Scheima took one last opportunity to remind the trio that in the future they would be wiser to "think before they acted."
