parts of which date back to 1270. The rest of the campus is scattered over the surrounding 60 acres of parkland.
All classes are taught in the castle. The students live in modern dormitories and a new library is scheduled for completion this month.
Among benefits cited by Acting Dean Greene is the exchange feature of the program that will bring 30 graduates of "N.O.I.B. to the University, along with an exchange professor. This will help University students to become more familiar with European and international business.
Because of their excellent preparation, it is expected that the Dutch students may earn a B.A. at the University in only one year of additional study.
The University professor, Daniel Remington, explained that the Netherlands Institute for Overseas Representation is a two-

year institution because students enter from secondary schools with an educational background about equal to American college juniors.
The Overseas Program with N.O.I.B. is the result of contracts made this summer in Europe by Acting Dean Greene.
Students from Oregon State University and Portland State College may participate, also.
Applicants should contact the School of Business Administration before the end of registration so that they may plan their schedule to complete all requirements before next fall.
Total cost to the student, travel and room and board is \$2,765 for in-state students and \$3,335 for out-of-state students.
Students may borrow up to \$1,800 of the cost through NDEA and University loans.
Remington said, in explaining the program: "Ten years from now the multi-national corporation will be the rule and not the exception. This program is designed to prepare students culturally and academically for careers in this changing environment."

Chamber Players Prepare Concert

Emerald Chamber Players will present a concert of 18th Century music at Gerlinger Hall at 8 p.m. Monday, January 11. The program will consist of Handel's Overture to Agrippina, Mozart's Concerto in E Flat Major (K. 107) for piano and string orchestra, Alessandro Scarlatti's Sinfonia in E Minor for Flute, Oboe, and Strings, and Johann Sebastian Bach's Suite No. 2 in B Minor for flute and string orchestra.
