ciskovich, the present NSA co-ordinator, objected that at least the ASUO president and the co-ordinator would have to be sent to the conference.

Franciskovich then proposed that the budget be \$1,100, which would allow two people to attend the conference. He said he plans to introduce a resolution later which would make these two people the coordinator and the vice-president. This was the amendment that passed 15-2 on a roll call vote.

NSA "Failure"

During the debate Franciskovich said, "NSA has been a failure this year. The delegates did

their jobs as delegates but when we came back they lost interest. None of the people who worked in NSA on this campus this year were delegates to the convention."

Senator-at-large Rick Williams said he had made "an informal survey of 104 students" and found that only about 10 percent supported NSA.

Goldschmidt Wants Six

Steve Goldschmidt, candidate for ASUO president, asked that the Senate approve sending six delegates to the conference.

"The people who have done absolutely nothing to make this a worthwhile program are those who continually ask that it be cut," Goldschmidt said. "We're not putting into NSA what we expect to get out of it. NSA can provide us with help in developing many programs but we haven't used it."

Horn to Discuss 'Winter's Tale'

The accent is on Shakespeare in tonight's Browning Room lecture starting at 7:30 p.m. Robert D. Horn, professor of English, will speak on the topic "Shakespeare's Winter Tale: An Autumn Play."

Horn has been actively interested in staging Shakespearean plays at the Very Little Theatre groups. In 1962, he wrote an article entitled "Shakespearean Performance as Criticism, Ashland, 1962" for the autumn issue of the Shakespeare Quarterly.

Spending considerable time in England at the Marlborough estate and at the British Museum, he has been gathering material on the Marlborough family, especially the first Duke of Marlborough (1650-1722). During the summer of 1963, he took a sabbatical leave to do research on the family and on Queen Anne literature.
