

Peruvians Praise Two JFK Programs

Two main weaknesses in the Alliance for Progress and Peace Corps programs in Peru were brought out by visiting Peruvian students Thursday at the International Coffee Hour.

The students, guests of the U.S. State Department, praised the two programs initiated by the late President Kennedy.

Although the Alliance for Progress program has played a "most important" role in Peru, the students agreed that the funds given by the U.S. are not being used for the people as a whole.

The distribution of U.S. money is presently administered by the Peruvian government. This ar-

angement has not been sufficient, the students said.

As Americo Infantas, one of the students, pointed out, it is the hope of the students that the U.S. would choose to supervise the distribution of the money.

Infantas said that more money should go to education instead of to industries, for "only through education will the so-called undeveloped countries rise."

Felipe Castilla said the Alliance for Progress program has furnished the monetary means to develop the industries and the agricultural production of Peru.

The students said the Peace Corps project in Peru has been a "wonderful idea," but would be

much more successful if the problem of communication could be solved.

Hugo Gallegos noted that the Peace Corps volunteers in Peru

have not been able to reach about two-thirds of the population, because of the great number of Indians who do not speak Spanish.

On the whole, the students expressed appreciation for both programs, which have contributed greatly to the advancement of their country.
