

# Tongue Point Official Takes University Job

Guy Schellenbarger, assistant director of the University's Job Corps Training Center at Astoria, has joined the School of Education faculty as an officer of administration, with the rank of associate professor, University President Arthur S. Flemming has announced.

He will be a supervisor of student teachers, many of whom will work with disadvantaged young people, according to Paul B. Jacobson, dean of the School.

Schellenbarger has been associated with the Job Corps Center as assistant to Center Director Douglas Olds since its inception. Before joining the Job Corps Center he was for 18 years principal of Marshfield High School in Coos Bay. He had served the Coos Bay school system in various capacities since 1934.

Olds said Schellenbarger's loss

will be keenly felt in the administration of the Job Corps Center. "His wide abilities in the field of school administration and his empathy with the Job Corps trainees made him indispensable during the center's formative period," Olds said.

Schellenbarger said that in his new position he hopes to be able to apply many of the principles in the Job Corps.

He is 57 years old, is married and has two daughters. He received both his bachelor's and master's degrees from the University. For eight years he has been a member of the editorial board of the National Association of Secondary School Principals.

• The congress endorsed the student protests at the University of California at Berkeley last year. They decided to conduct a fundraising drive to help cover the legal expense of the demonstrators arrested at the Sproul hall sit-in.

• The congress called for the United States to end all "offensive" military action in Viet Nam as the first step toward a general cease-fire and negotiations, but also supported U.S. "presence" in that country.

• The congress called for the U.S. to sponsor admission of Red China to the United Nations.

• The congress "unconditionally" condemned U.S. intervention in Santo Domingo.

• Former ASUO President Phil Sherburne was elected president of the organization. Sherburne served as national affairs vice president last year, ran unopposed.
