

Rummel Appointed Grad Dean

J. Francis Rummel has been appointed to the University Office of Student Affairs as associate dean of students for graduate students, Donald M. DuShane, dean of students, has announced.

Rummel is a professor of educational psychology, measurement, and research in the University's School of Education and he will continue to devote part of his time to the school.

The appointment of an associate dean of students to serve graduate students is occasioned by the rapid growth of the University's Graduate School, which has been growing at a rate about one and a half times as fast as the University average.

In the 1964-65 fall term the University's graduate enrollment was 2,229. Projections indicate graduate enrollment in the 1965-66 fall term will be 2,450, or more than 21 per cent of the total enrollment.

In his new position, Rummel will serve graduate students as part of the University's interest in their special needs, personal welfare and professional development.

Rummel joined the University faculty in 1950 as an assistant professor of education, and became a professor in 1961. From 1961 to 1963 he was the personnel director of the School of Education, in which he administered the graduate programs for students working on masters and doctors degrees.

Check Cashing Rules Given

The Student Union has announced regulations for cashing checks at the main desk:

- A current validated student body card must be shown; faculty and staff must show a University card.
 - There is a \$10 daily limit on personal checks; traveler's checks are limited to \$20. Amounts must be in even dollars.
 - Bank account numbers must be shown for counter checks.
 - Information on the check must include student body number, campus address and campus telephone number.
- The SU Board recommended last spring that students passing bad checks in the SU be prosecuted by the Student Court.

Membership in the Friends of the Museum, at \$10 a year for regular membership and \$1 a year for students, entitles individuals to rent works from the gallery at rates based on the purchase price of the item. Renters wishing to buy may apply rental fees to the purchase price.

Mrs. Keith Stenshoel is chairman for the 1965-66 gallery season. Mrs. Ron Boehi is co-chairman in charge of the project, Art in Scholls.

Gallery hours for the coming season are from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. Tuesday and Thursday.

Please bear with us during those occasional times when the Main Desk is unable to cash your check. An average of \$200 in checks is cashed each hour and unexpected demands deplete the supply of cash on hand.
