Bunker Leads Receiving Stats

Oregon's Steve Bunker moved into the AAWU lead in the conference's pass receiving category last weekend as he caught four passes for a total of 18 completions.

Doug Flansburg of Washington State, last week's leader, didn't snag a pass in the Cougar's game with Villanova and slipped to second place. Bunker has gained 355 yards and three touchdowns on 18 passes while Flansburg has totaled 211 on 17.

Oregon halfback Scott Cress, catching nine aeriels, has also scored three TDs on passes and totaled 108 yards through the air. Ray Palm of Oregon is tied for third in receptions with 15 for 233 yards.

Lewis has totaled 665 yards, Garret 659 and Trovato 576. Garrett has gained 647 yards of his total on the ground, a situation that is unique to this particular category.

Garrett, obviously, leads in rushing with 647 yards, way ahead of runner-up Pete Pifer of Oregon State with 380. Garrett also leads the PAC scoring race with seven touchdowns and 42 points. Cress trails in second place with five TDs and 30 points.

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ference in the passing offense with 919 yards, seven touchdowns and a 230-yard average in four games. The second place team is Stanford with 704 yards and three touchdowns.

Oregon also tops the rushing defense, along with PAC leader USC. Both teams have given up 397 yards on the ground.



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The same two squads lead the total offense category, with the Trojans in first place and the Webfoots in second. USC has a 380-yard average on 1518 yards while the Ducks have a 348-yard average on 1393 yards.

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
