Portland poet David Ray will give a reading of his own poetry in a program at the University Thursday.

The reading, sponsored by the Department of English, will be at 4 p.m. in the Student Union. The public is invited.

Ray, an assistant professor in the Department of Literature and Humanities at Reed College, is a graduate of the University of Chicago, where he also received his Master of Arts degree. He has previously taught at Wright Junior College, Northern Illinois University, and Cornell University.

Ray's poems, fiction, and reviews have been published in many journals. He has also published a book of poems and edited

several magazines and anthologies. Ray is currently preparing a new book of poems, entitled "Coming Into Portland."
