

First Ecumenical Program Features Talk, Hootenanny

The term's first ecumenical religious program gets under way this weekend when six of the religious groups on campus combine to present H. Royce Salzman discussing "Modern Church Music," followed by a hootenanny. Two other such programs are planned for the term.

The program, set for 6 p.m. Sunday at Wesley Foundation, is the joint venture of Canterbury Club (Episcopal), Christian House (Disciples and American Baptist), Luther House (Lutheran), Newman Center (Roman Catholic), Wesley Foundation (Methodist) and Westminster House (Presbyterian).

In a joint statement issued by the presidents of the six organizations, the groups said the program was a result of "a common concern for the effectiveness of the total Christian ministry on this campus, and because we feel our various denominational ties do not force us to compete in the presentation of programs of general interest to all our groups."

House emphasized that all types of music will be sung at the hootenanny. Karen and Doug Winn, the Gruesome Twosome (Gene Garrett and Addison Talbot) and a group led by Peter Mayne will lead the hootenanny.

Other ecumenical programs this term will include a discussion with faculty members on issues confronting the campus today on Feb. 6, and a Feb. 27 showing of T. S. Elliot's "Murder in the Cathedral." All three programs are open to the public and are free of charge.
