

Candidates Talk At Noon Today

Two candidates for senator-at-large in Wednesday's ASUO primary election will speak at noon today from the Free Speech Platform.

Gary and Marvin Feuerberg, both graduate students in sociology, will discuss several issues.

They said Sunday that they will emphasize two main areas:

- Student forms to evaluate faculty members, a proposal now being worked on by the ASUO.

- Student - controlled research, which means that student funds would be used to hire researchers to investigate possible changes in curriculum and educational programs.

Marvin Feuerberg said they hope that well thought out ideas in these areas would be better received by the faculty, which has the final voice on curriculum change.

They will also discuss student - sponsored lectures-in-residence and methods of financing these proposals.

"You must believe in the reality of cybernation if you are going to accept this argument," Theobald claimed.

The first commercial computer was put into use in 1950, and the speaker estimated that about 70,000 would be in use by 1970.

A major problem encountered in providing everyone with an income, whether he works or not, is the fact that "The American feels downgraded unless he has a job," he said.

Must Be Retrained

Men will have to be re-trained in the future, to use their minds more creatively, so that they do not feel downgraded when they spend most of their time in leisure.

"However, you cannot believe in the guaranteed income if you don't believe man is responsible," he said, because "our society would slowly corrode, unless man did have a sense of responsibility." In other words, everyone would not be able to just sit back and wait for their government checks.

Theobald said he disagreed with economist Robert Lampman, who spoke Thursday at the Poverty Conference.

Lampman had said that poverty was being eliminated at a reasonable rate.

"If you look at the relative figures, you can see that the income of the bottom ten per cent has not risen," Theobald commented.

Men Less Attractive

Increasing wage rates and costs of living are making men less and less attractive to employers, since machines do not require wages.

This condition, said Theobald, will eventually lead to a great number of people who are considered "unemployable."

The speaker also took issue with some of Arthur Pearl's Thursday statements.

"Pearl grossly underestimates the shift in human attitudes which is going to be required when we get the poor to take up service careers," Theobald said.
