## 'Why Viet Nam' Film Here Today

The film, "Why Viet Nam," just released by the Department of Defense, will be shown at 4 p.m. today in the World Affairs Briefing Center in the Student Union.

The film traces the history of the Viet Nam situation from the French withdrawal up to the present time, and specifically the development of the U.S. commitment there from economic aid, to military advisors, to combat units.

President Johnson, Secretary of State Rusk, and Secretary of Defense McNamara explain the reasons for this growing commitment, our goals in Viet Nam, and U.S. policy towards expanding the war and negotiations.

## Lamanski to Talk At SDS Meeting

Lamanski will speak on the "Bill Epton Story." Epton was sentenced to five years imprisonment for allegedly starting and organizing the Harlem riots in New York.
