

Grant Finances Center In Mental Retardation

The University received \$100,000 from the Vocational and Rehabilitation Act to establish a regional rehabilitation, research, and training center in mental retardation Friday.

The center, one of four in the country, will do considerable work in the behavioral aspect of moderate, mild, and borderline cases, according to Herbert J. Prehm, associate professor of education and director of the project.

Research in teaching methods as well as looking for better ways to measure and predict the social adjustment of a mentally retarded child to adult society will be conducted by the center.

It will also sponsor short institutes for professional personnel out in the field. These will be open to all persons in the rehabilitative fields — psychologists, public health nurses, social workers, physicians, and school personnel.

Another center program will

include graduate work at the Ph.D. level to prepare people for research, college teaching, and work in local, state, and national programs dealing with mental retardation.

The center will also provide out-patient counseling on a limited basis for young adult retardates who want to enter the "working world" and their families, Prehm said.

Scholar to Talk On Spanish Lit

A Cambridge University professor will speak at 8 p.m. today in the Student Union on literature of the Spanish baroque period.

Edward Meryon Wilson, a Fellow of the British Academy, will discuss "Calderon and the Kill-Joys" in a lecture sponsored by the University department of romance languages.

Wilson has won distinction for his studies of the 17th century Spanish dramatist Pedro Calderon de la Barca and of the poet Luis de Gongora.

Currently a professor of Spanish at Emmanuel College of Cambridge University, Wilson was Cervantes Professor of Spanish at the University of London for eight years, and Jane Eliza Procter Visiting Fellow at Princeton University in 1932-33.

He was present in Spain during the 1930's when events were occurring which reflected the upheavals of modern Spain. In 1930 he saw the fall of the dictator Primo de Rivera and when the civil war broke out in July, 1936, Wilson was evacuated first from the city and later from Spain.

Wood picked up firsts in both the 200- and 500-yard freestyles. He defeated two Cougars easily to win the 200 in 1:54.8.

Wood and Holding teamed up to finish one-two in yet another tight finish to sweep the 500 freestyle. Both were timed in 5:19.8.

This double was the only one-two sweep by either team. It also put Oregon ahead to stay.

"The double in the 500 was the key to our victory," stated Van Rossen.

Going into the 400-yard freestyle relay, Oregon held a slim 45-43 lead. The winner of the final event would also have the meet victory.

Oregon's freestylers—Greening, Dave MacKenzie, Don Smith and Bruce Hess — finished first in 3:24.2. WSU was clocked in 3:16.7.

"They had a good effort, but our boys held them off well," concluded Van Rossen.
