

Baseball Team Displays Hitting Power

Spring vacation was a little tougher on some people than on others.

Like, for instance, Oregon baseball coach Don Kirsch.

His Duck diamond squad traveled to Arizona and Utah last week for an eight-game tour—four contests with the University of Arizona, three with Arizona State and one with Utah State—and gained only a single win.

"We met two of the nation's best baseball teams," Kirsch said Monday as he prepared for his team's home opener against Linfield Wednesday. "We had only been outside for two days."

Arizona State is the defending national champions and Arizona was rated in the nation's top five during the 1965 campaign.

Bad weather allowed the Oregon team to work outdoors only those few times before the tour of the southwest and the Ducks, according to Kirsch, suffered from a "lack of work. Our pitchers hadn't even played an intra squad game. The infield defense was giving away lots of unearned runs."

"Not Unexpected"

"And they'd played 12 to 15 games already; they were ready."

But Kirsch was quick to add that he hadn't counted on much more than what took place. "It was not unexpected by any means."

The lone win for the Ducks was scored in a March 22 game against ASU at Tempe, 14-9. The

win left Oregon with a 1-1 mark and Arizona State with an 11-3 record.

Although the Webfoots dropped six more contests after their win, their play improved steadily during the latter part of the tour. The final two losses to Arizona Saturday were by one-run margins, 5-4 and 4-3.

The opening game of the doubleheader saw Oregon move into

a 3-0 lead early in the contest, only to fall behind, 5-4, in the eighth inning on an error and four singles by Arizona.

After dropping behind by a 3-0 score in the final, Oregon rallied with three runs with singles by Dick Ogan, Ron Delplanche and Steve Bunker and a two-run-producing double by Rich Armstrong.

Play Satisfies

"Toward the end of the week," said Kirsch, "I was satisfied with the play. Our hitting in certain spots was very good. Delplanche had a fine week—14 hits, several for extra bases."

Entry blanks for the spring sports intramural program should be turned into the IM office by 2 p.m. Tuesday.

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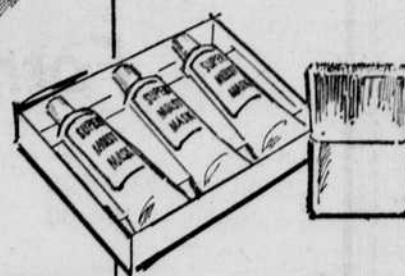
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
