out in time to save the furniture." He means the process of "freeing" a country but retaining economic influence in that country.

Worthy pointed to Malaysia, a federation which he said was created artificially by Britain to get as much rubber and copper as possible out of that country.

• He noted that the wording in Philippine passports which keeps Filipinos from going to Communist countries is exactly the same as the wording used by the U.S. State Department "That's how closely Manila follows the Washington line," said Worthy. "They

were't even original enough to think up their own wording."

But he said there is a wider-growing split between the people of the Philippines and the government "elected in fraudulent, violent elections."

He says there is now a "respectability for nationalism" in the Philippines that "wasn't there five years ago." He noted that many powerful, rich aristocratic families are getting involved in nationalist movements.

In order to refute the argument that the United States is fighting a "white men's war" against a small people in Viet Nam—an argument that Worthy says carries a lot of weight in other parts of the world—the U.S. has gotten countries like South Korea and the Philippines to send more troops.

"But the world knows who's paying the bills and whose arms are being twisted," says Worthy. "It's only the American people who are paying the bills through higher taxes, who have the illusion that the war in Viet Nam is not an American war."

• Since the end of the Korean war, North Korea has made

an impressive economic comeback and nearly rebuilt the country, Worthy says.

He says there is "tremendous sentiment" in North Korea and among the students and nationalist groups in South Korea for reunification, sentiment which is "squashed by U.S. occupation forces in the South."

He said North Korea has plans to move into South Korea when the people in the South rise up and tell the U.S. to get out, which is sure to happen as "night follows day."

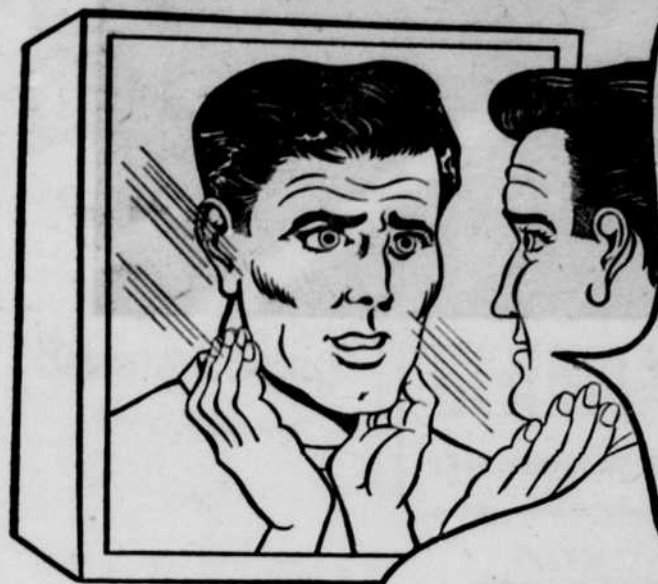
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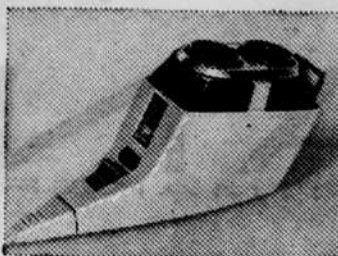
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
