Six student church groups are starting a Cooperative Christian Ministry this term as "an attempt to express the wholeness and integrity of the Christian witness in the academic world." The six are Christian House, Episcopal Campus Center, Luther House, Newman Center, Wesley Foundation, and Westminster House.

Each group will continue most of its present programs, but will joint in several new ones, including a planning project. "Sunday Forum," a series on challenges posed by the modern secular world, will get under way at 8 p.m. Sunday at Wesley Foundation on "Churches in Ferment: Report on a European Ecumenical Study Tour."

Research commissions will be established to study the role of student church groups. These findings will then be used by a delegate planning conference in May to discuss the direction the Co-operative Christian ministry should take.

"The Womb," a coffeehouse in the basement of Westminster House is one co-operative project already started.

"The Gospel is a Gospel of reconciliation," Disciples of Christ campus minister Jay Rea explained. "We must express this Gospel, first of all by looking to our own household." Instead of continuing as six competing groups,

then, the six will move toward learning to live in one religious community.

"What is important," said Rea, "is not what I give up and how much I become less denominational, but what I can gain by sharing with others the differing, but similar, heritages that are ours."
