

# Boycott, Panel Slated To Support Workers

A nationwide boycott of Schenley (fermented) grape products has gained momentum in the Eugene area this week.

The University chapter of Students for a Democratic Society is sponsoring a table on the Student Union terrace this week in support of the Farm Workers' Strike in Delano, Calif. Included in the week's activities will be a peti-

tion pledging support for the boycott of Schenley products, as well as an effort to collect money, food, and clothing for the strikers.

In addition, SDS will sponsor a panel discussion on the Delano situation at 7 p.m. Wednesday in the Student Union. Included in the panel will be Dan and Paige Knapp of the VISTA training staff, and Greg Johnson and Gunnar Lundberg, University students who have visited the area.

A Sympathy Pilgrimage is scheduled for later in the week, which will coincide with the Farm Workers' Pilgrimage from Delano to Sacramento, Calif.

The National Farm Workers' Association, the farm workers organization, is asking for recognition as the workers' representative and for negotiations with the growers over wages and living conditions. Because of Schenley's failure to co-operate with the workers, the NFWA called for the nationwide boycott.

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# Peace Corps Applicants To Be Given Reception

A special reception and informal discussion for University Peace Corps applicants will be held Wednesday in the Dad's room of the SU.

Applicants will have a chance to meet and talk with several Peace Corps Directors and volunteers: Ross Pritchard, Director of the Corp's Far East Region; Lenard Clarke, former Director in Sierra Leone; Kirby Jones, returned volunteer from the Dominican Republic; Peter Morrissey from Indonesia; and Charlotte Crawford from Pakistan.

A new color film, "Our Man in Borneo" will be shown at 7 p.m., and, following the film, at 7:30, a panel discussion will be held. Current issues and controversy relating to the Peace Corps will be topics: is the Peace Corps Volun-

teer an agent of American Foreign Policy? What is community development accomplishing in Latin America? What is the job of a Peace Corps teacher in Africa and in Asia?

The session will be open, and questions and comments from applicants will be welcomed. Applicants may meet the Peace Corps representatives informally after the discussion.

They will also be available in the Peace Corps Committee Office in the SU on Thursday for personal interviews concerning overseas assignments, training programs, or other matters of concern to applicants.

Peace Corps placement tests will be conducted at 9 a.m. Saturday, Apr. 9, in Room 12 of the Eugene Post Office, 520 Willam-

ette Street. The tests are general aptitude tests, with a section on modern language aptitudes. They are used to aid the selection division in determining where the applicant could best be used.

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
