

Students Offered Gas Discount

An ASUO senator has lined up three Eugene gas stations and is working on a fourth to offer discounts to students.

The discounts will be on gasoline and other services. Lee Bollinger, senator-at-large, says the Signal station at 1811 Franklin Blvd., the Hancock station at 19th and Onyx, and the Pride of Oregon station at 782 East Broadway have already agreed to the program. The American station at Onyx and Franklin will also participate but its plans are not yet complete.

Bollinger said the program will start "as soon as the students start going in and buying gas." Students will be able to get the discount by presenting their student body card.

Discounts will generally be two or three per cent on gas and 25 to 50 per cent on parts and services.

Bollinger said he also is working on discounts at hamburger places and clothing stores.

He said he had tried grocery stores but that their small margin made discounts impossible.
