

# Diamond Team Sets Husky Series

Coach Don Kirsch cautioned his baseball team that weekend foe Washington will be no pushover. "I thought the team may let up a little since we beat Washington six times in Northern Division play last year," said Kirsch, "so I reminded them that the two players who contributed the most to those victories are not with us this year."

Kirsch was referring to Keith Lampard and Don Banderas who were particularly outstanding against the Huskies. "Lampard went 10-19, including three homers, and Banderas stole five bases during the series," Kirsch recalled.

The Ducks play the Huskies three games during the weekend, playing a single game Friday at

3 p.m., and a doubleheader beginning at 1:30 on Saturday at Howe Field.

Currently the Huskies are 11-6 on the season, with a 1-2 record in Northern Division competition. Last weekend they established their conference record against pre-season favorite Washington State. Kirsch pointed out that all three games were close, which indicated to the Duck mentor that the Huskies will be tough.

Washington lost 12 seniors last year, and are in the midst of a rebuilding year. Coach Ken Lehman believes that most of the returnees are inexperienced or sophomores, but they have good team speed and hitting power.

Two year lettermen shortstop Doug Sherry and outfielder Charley Johnson are the mainstays in the Washington lineup. Outstanding

sophomores will dominate the Husky lineup. These will include first baseman Tom White, outfielders Dave Lambert and Mike Hall, and infielder Billy Parker.

Washington's pitching staff is headed by senior letterman Lonnie Sherick. Herb Mueller and Ron Martin serve as other front line hurlers.

Kirsch said that he will probably start Ken Hadden on the mound in Friday's game, and will have Mike Nicksic and Jerry Gjesvold starting the two games Saturday.

Although Kirsch said he was disappointed about losing two of three games to Oregon State last weekend, he was pleased with some parts of the Duck's game.

"We outhit them and outscored them during the series but still lost two," Kirsch said. "In the third game we had runners on with the strong part of the order

at bat several times, but we couldn't get the runs across."

"I was pleased with the pitching performances of Gjesvold and Nicksic," Kirsch said. "Nicksic doesn't have a fast ball right now because of an arm injury he suffered earlier this year. He is getting by using a curve and being crafty."

Kirsch said that he felt the hitting would have to improve if the Ducks are to be contenders for the Northern Division crown. "Our pitching and defense is spotty," Kirsch said, "and our hit-

ting is going to have to make up for that."

Thursday the Ducks are playing a makeup game at Lewis and Clark. The game was scheduled for Wednesday, but was postponed because of rain.

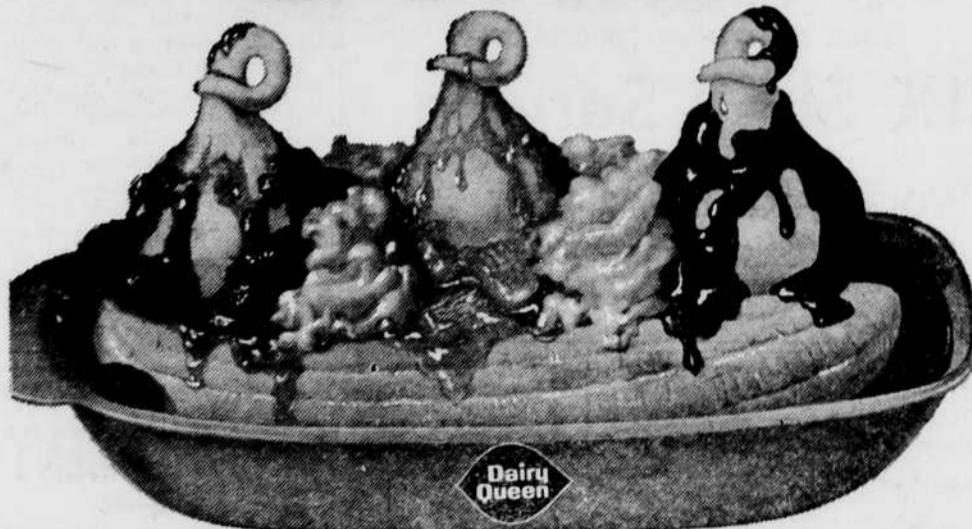
