New Folk Music Society To Present 1st Program

When Chuck Foster, a red-bearded Irishman from Belfast, came to Eugene in September, he expected to find a thriving folk music society here.

He didn't.

So he set out to remedy the situation. His group will present their first program at 8 p.m. Friday in the Bottom-of-the-Bowl. Admission is free.

Foster, who previously attended Queens University in Belfast, said the folk music society there draws about 600 persons to its

weekly sessions. Queens is an institution roughly half the size of the University.

When he didn't find any such group at the University, Foster decided there should be one. Mostly through personal contacts—"I knew there had to be a lot of people in a city the size of Eugene who would be interested in a group like this"—Foster formed the University Folk Music Society.

The society is seeking recognition from the University, but Foster expects no trouble on that score. "It should be almost automatic," he observed.

He said the society's purpose lies "primarily in entertainment for the students, but also to bring folk music to them from other countries."

Friday's program will feature folk music from Spain and Ire-

land, but the bulk will be American.

"We want to attract students into our organization," Foster said. "There must be dozens of guitars lying around in dormitories, and I know there's a lot of talent here."

Foster said another aspect of the society might include instrumental workshops ("we might have one to teach people to play bluegrass banjo"), but described it as "essentially impractical."

"We're interested also in encouraging contemporary song—not that we're discouraging pure folk music. But at our hootenannies, you'll probably hear music by Dylan, Buffy Sainte-Marie . . ."

Orchestra to Hold Concert Today

The University Symphony Orchestra concert at 8 p.m. today in the School of Music auditorium will feature a young musician from Stuttgart, Germany, as guest conductor and piano soloist.

Helmut vom Hoff will conduct the orchestra during Bela Bartok's "Rumanian Folk Dances" and Franz Schubert's "Symphony No. 3 in D Major" and perform the piano solo for Mozart's "Concerto for Piano and Orchestra in D Major, K. 537" ("Coronation").

Lawrence Maves, assistant professor of music, will conduct the orchestra during the Mozart concerto, a work rarely performed on the concert stage.

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Annuity Purchase Date Extended

University faculty and staff have another month to purchase tax-deferred annuities on their 1966 salaries, the Office of Business Affairs of the State Board of Higher Education announced Wednesday.

The open period for purchase of the annuities has been extended to May 31. The deadline for obtaining a tax-deferred annuity was previously this Friday.

A faculty or staff member, in purchasing a tax-deferred annuity contract, saves part of his salary, together with the Federal income tax he would pay on that amount of salary, for retirement income.

University employees may purchase tax-deferred annuities from Variable Annuity Life Insurance Company, Standard Insurance Company, or Teachers Insurance & Annuity Association-College Retirement Equities

Fund (TIAA-CREF).

It is recommended that plans be compared before purchase. Among the benefits offered by some private companies is the advantage of possible withdrawal of funds in an emergency for purposes other than retirement or disability pay.

The next open period for the purchase of 1967 contracts will be during November and December.

Interested persons can obtain additional information about tax-deferred annuities by arranging an appointment with Henry Osibov, assistant to the dean of faculties. Call ext. 337 to make an appointment.

The University Office of Faculty Personnel is booked solid with appointments for the remainder of April, according to Osibov. More than 65 faculty members have applied for special contracts with TIAA-CREF since Jan. 1.
