Ducks, Beavers Collide In Cinder Civil War

Beavers on the right . . .
Beavers on the left . . .
Beavers all around. Say Colonel, we're surrounded.

The Civil War rivalry between OSU and the Oregon Ducks resumes 1:15 p.m. Saturday at Hayward Field when the two schools clash in the first of two Duck-Beaver track-and-field meets this spring.

The form charts seem to indicate a real whing-ding affair. Oregon coach Bill Bowerman said earlier this week: "The meet could be one of the best seen in a long time," and OSU coach Bernie Wagner has also indicated that he expects a really outstanding attraction.

Always Close

In the last six meets between the two schools the biggest margin of victory has been 15 points.

The Duck "sure" wins are in the shot-put and discus where Neal Steinhauer is seven feet better than OSU's Lachlan Samsam, and better than 19 feet in the discus over Don Tollefson of the Beavers.

In the broad jump the Beavers must be considered the favorites with Tony Albin over 24 feet and the Duck's best jumper, Bob Woodell, in the hospital with a broken back.

However, Herman Brame has been pushing 24 feet for the past couple of weeks and could be a surprise.

The Beavers have an overwhelming superiority in the javelin with Phil Lowry beyond the 241 foot mark. However, the Ducks' Bill Heikkila is overdue to let out a big one and may make the competition a little more competitive than expected if he has a good day.

The other Duck strong points include the 880, mile, and two

mile events with such outstanding performers as Mike Crunican, who just received the most improved spiker award for his consistent efforts in lowering his times this spring. Don Scott, Wade Bell, Ken Moore, and Bruce Mortenson.

It is likely that Bell will double in the mile and the 880 with Moore a possible double in the mile and the two mile events. Crunican and Scott are entered in the half mile competition.

Lumby Out

In the sprints the Beavers are hurting with their "flash," Butch Lumby ailing with an Achilles Heel condition. Mike Diebele must be considered the pre-meet favorite in both the 100 and 220.

However, the Ducks are in a similar position in the 440 as Gordy Payne is doubtful with a

painful bone spur. If he is out, the Ducks will lose points to the Beavers in this event. Probable Duck entries include Dean Southam and Paul Cope.

The high hurdles should belong to Bob Blum, who owns the second fastest time in the PAC this spring. Blum will be joined by Paul Elliott and Marcial Hunter, as they try to shut-out Beavers Craig Sonnison and Denny Bonn.

Beavers Favored

In the pole vault the Ducks take the back seat to two vaulters who have cleared 15 feet in John Hergenrather (15-5³/₄) and Bob Glaeser. The Duck hopes include Bob Varley and Dennis Keller. Varley cleared 15 feet against UCLA for the best Duck mark of 1966.

Wagner was contemplating this week's upcoming meet and with a tone of amazement, analyzed that his Beavers are one of the only teams in the country to meet the defending NCAA co-champions on successive week-ends.

In analyzing his team's chances, Oregon coach Bill Bowerman figures the Ducks must capture at least one relay. As he noted, "We could be in real trouble if we lost both relays."

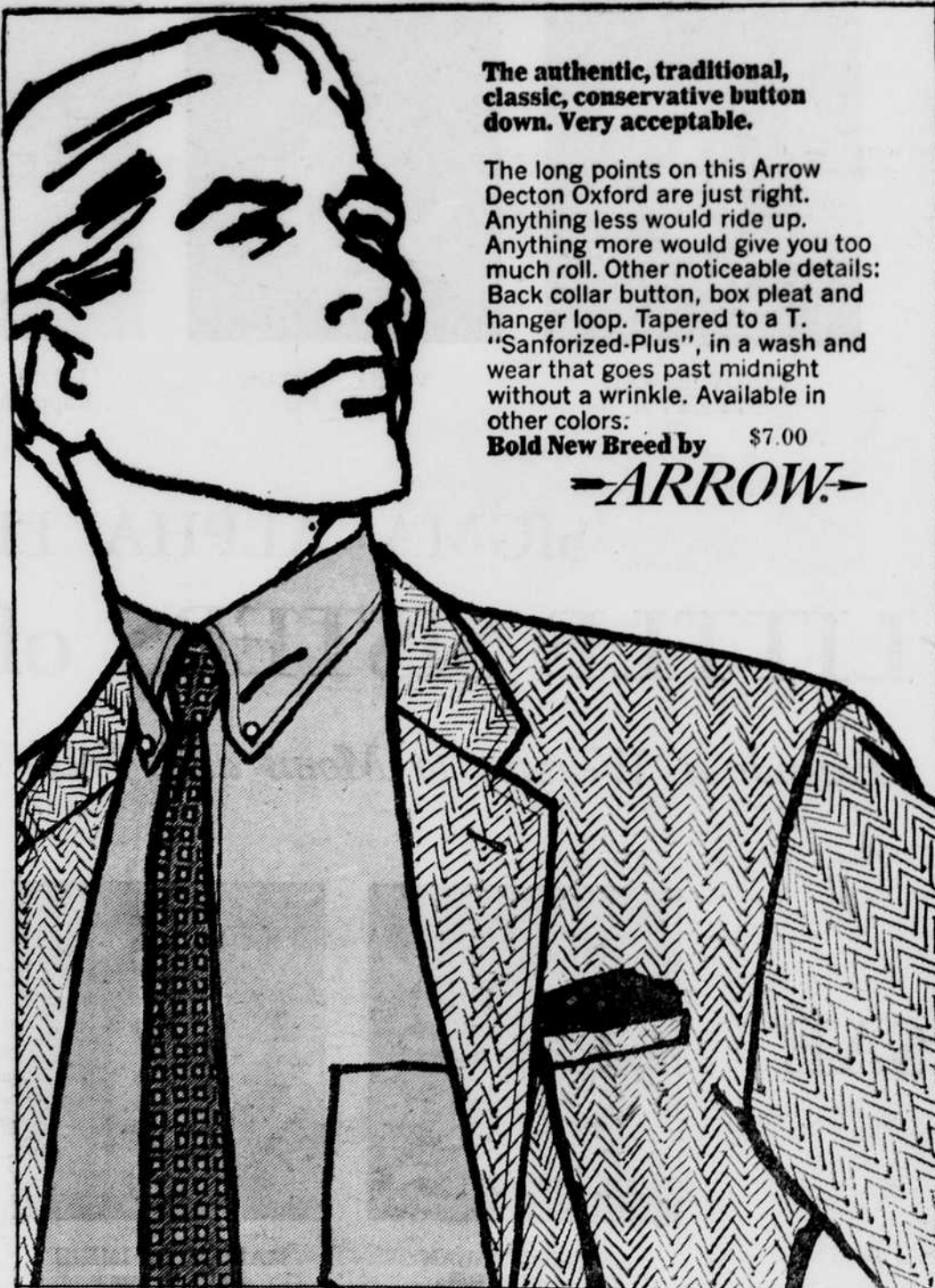
