these issues are turned down by the faculty.

● Referendums should be held so the students can either approve or disapprove Senate stands on national issues.

His other reforms include pass or fail grades in P.E. courses but he says that the student should have the choice of deciding if they want credit or not.

Outside the major, he favors pass-or-fail grades for the 36 hours that the University administration passed three years ago. "They failed to provide the courses for this program at that time, however," Caufield added.

If the majority of the faculty refuses to take part in the evaluation program, he said he would like to see an "Ad Hoc," off-campus group, such as the one in Berkeley, take over the publication of such a pamphlet. He feels that all professors should be rated whether they like it or not, in order to promote better education.

Caufield answered that if the faculty is left to decide individually if they want to be rated, only those who are good will agree and the system will not work. If all professors are rated by an off-campus group, students will "pack" those classes in which the instructors are good, while other classes will go unfilled. Thus, effective pressure will be applied to the administration for better instructors.

Senator-at-large candidates Ed Davis and Tom Mesher joined the group of candidate hopefuls speaking at the Free Speech Platform.

Davis said that he is in favor of a "change in the academic structure" but he feels that students should "try to work with the faculty for reform instead of alienating them."

He said that he feels Senate stands on national and international issues are wrong because they aren't representative and candidates are not elected on their stands. He added that this doesn't show what the students think.

He also contends that the National Student Association is both compulsory and undemocratic be-

cause a small clique take the stands.

Mesher emphasized educational reform during his speech. He said that he is in favor of pass-or-fail P.E., an academic ap-

peals board, freshman seminars, credit by exam and a five-hour course base.

He said that he is willing to investigate the Co-op's book buying and selling practices.
