student opinion. The project has a two-fold purpose: to provide students with an organized survey of student opinion for their use as a basis of course selection during registration and to provide faculty members with an organized summary of student opinion for their use in improving course presentation.

2. Whether or not a Course Rating Booklet is published next fall is dependent upon two things: the validity of the sample taken this spring and the extent to which the sample taken ranges over the majority of large section, sequence courses the majority of students are enrolled in.

3. To my knowledge, President Flemming has not made clear to what extent the results of this spring's informal, experimental survey are to be used for promotion and tenure purposes. In any event, the general University faculty will be consulted before a definite decision is made in this area.

In summary, let me state that the survey being conducted this week is of a highly informal, experimental nature. Publication of a booklet summarizing the findings of the survey is only one of the many possible uses to which the results may be put.

The key point is that large sections of the faculty have shown their willingness to take part in this co-operative effort to improve communication; the initiative now lies with the students. It is to be hoped that the responses given to the questions asked on the form being administered this week are above all of a thoughtful and responsible nature.
