

Educational TV Seminar Topic

A special seminar in educational television is taking place at the University through Wednesday.

Participants will be the trainees who are enrolled in the inter-institutional Institute for Educational Media Specialists being held this summer at Oregon State University.

The institute is financed by a grant from the U.S. Office of Education.

The seminar will provide an opportunity for trainees to plan educational television productions in the University's television studios. They will be divided into three teams to plan, rehearse, and tape the productions.

On the final day of the seminar, the results of their efforts

will be played back for analysis and discussion.

Ralph Steetle of the Division of Continuing Education, will address trainees Monday morning on "The Impact of Educational Television in America."

Other seminar lecturers will be Mrs. Barbara Mathews, assistant coordinator for television, and radio coordinator, Eugene Public Schools; Ronald Sherriffs, operations manager for the University's Division of Broadcast Services; Martha Chambers, television teacher for the Eugene Public Schools; and John Shepherd, director of the Division of Broadcast Services and director of the seminar.
