

FSC Plans Activities for Summer

The Faculty-Student Committee to Stop the War in Viet Nam has announced an intensified campaign to arouse campus interest this summer. Events include a peace trip dance, art festival, and production of Barbara Garson's satiric drama "McBird."

"Part of our series of anti-war films may have to be deferred to fall term," said Michael Segari, FSC chairman, "but the faculty-conducted seminar workshop is definitely on. We'll have a speaker in July."

In the past FSC has sponsored Southeast Asia experts Bernard Fall and Felix Green, and Donald Duncan, the Green Beret who resigned in disgust at the pointless brutality of United States military acts in Viet Nam.

As weekly routine FSC will continue to staff its literature table on the Student Union terrace. Membership in FSC is open
