

338 Men Pledge UO Fraternities

Fraternities at the University ended their formal fall rush period Tuesday after pledging a total of 338 men, in the 21 national fraternity houses on the campus.

According to Inter-Fraternity Council President Warren Houston, an unofficial count revealed that 610 men went through the pledge lines this year, compared with 478 last year. Last year's final pledge total was 286.

According to these figures, 55 per cent of the men who went through fraternity rush this year were finally pledged, compared with 59 per cent after last year's rush.

Portland students pledged by the Greek houses totaled 78, and 39 pledges were from Eugene.
