

SU Board Revises PA System Policy

Editor's Note: Due to the amount of business the Student Union Board accomplished in its longest meeting on record Wednesday, the report on its meeting has been divided into two parts. For coverage on its decision to permit a Peace Corps tent on the SU lawn, see page one of Thursday's Emerald.

Student Union policy governing the public address system was revised by the SU Board Wednesday.

The revision includes the following points:

- The public address unit is made available to enable persons engaged in speeches, debates, and discussions to make themselves heard. It is not intended to be used for program promotion or advertising purposes.

- Because it is the intention of the Board to have the public address unit available for use at all times, it should be returned to the main desk when not in actual use as specified in the other parts of the policy.

The Board also selected Paul Finlay as Movie Committee chairman and Mark Stephens as Personnel Committee chairman.

Stephens was also chosen as a delegate to the Association of College Unions conference to be held at the University October 20-22.

Dr. William Lawton, a Eugene physician, was approved as University ski coach. Lawton has coached at Montana State University and has competed twice in national skiing competition.

The Board also gave special permission for recordings of Marc and Andre, a French singing duet, to be sold in the SU at the same time as their concert November 9 in the Ballroom.

Ordinarily no commercial enterprises whatsoever are allowed in the SU, but in this case the recordings are not available commercially in the United States.

Record sales after the concert are the only means students have to obtain a recording. This, plus the fact that the concert is being held in conjunction with the French department, was enough justification to permit records to be sold, the Board felt.

Tickets for the Marc and Andre concert are \$1.75 each.

The Board also granted permission for a Homecoming banner to be hung from the third floor of the SU facing 13th Avenue, for two weeks before Homecoming.
