

Board Views Frantic SU Action in Slapstick Film

The Student Union Board passed a motion Wednesday allocating room 309 SU to office space for the ASUO.

ASUO President Henry Drummonds will decide which ASUO programs will use the room. The board has the right to review his decision.

A nine-minute film entitled "An Editorial Comment on the Erb Memorial Student Union" was shown the board. The film covered all aspects of the SU. It was shown at 24 frames per second, which is 24 times faster than it was shot, to "show the crowded conditions of the building and the pressure," said Board

Member Ken Settlemier who filmed and edited the film. The film was done by Chuck Duff of the department of continuing education.

Pace Furious

The movie began with students going in and out the front doors at a furious pace, and moved to shots of the Fishbowl where students talked, ate, and smoked as if there would be no tomorrow. Downstairs bowling pins were knocked down and pool balls disappeared at an incredible rate. A haircut took no more than one second, if that much.

Back at the cafeteria a dozen hamburgers were swooped off the griddle at one time, and gobbled down almost that fast. Two of the students eating and talking were last year's ASUO president, Steve Goldschmidt, and his vice-president, Tom Clark.

Results Humorous

Other scenes showed hectic transactions at the main desk, students sleeping in the Taylor Lounge, third floor office scenes, what must have been the shortest banquet ever, and countless other functions of the SU, all at a frantic run-run pace.

The result, said Sanford Tepfer, was "artistic and humorous," and "captures the spirit of the union." Tepfer felt, however, that the film did not effectively get across the editorial viewpoint.

In other business, the board approved a revised list of those

who receive complimentary tickets to special attractions. Eight names were knocked from the list, reducing it to 50 persons. The revision was needed since there are only enough complimentary tickets for 50 for any given event, and sometimes less.

The board also approved a Homecoming request to put paper tents on the tables in the SU for four or five days. The board gave permission for a 10-minute Homecoming skit to be performed at 11 a.m. Friday in the Fishbowl.

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Green's 'China' Slated Saturday

"China," a widely acclaimed documentary filmed on the mainland of China, will be presented at 3 and 8:30 p.m. Saturday in 150 Science.

The film is sponsored by the campus Students for a Democratic Society. Price of admission is 75 cents.

Felix Greene, who wrote and produced the films, is an internationally-known authority on Red China. He covered roughly 15,000 miles in 1964, talking with political figures, factory workers, students, and peasants in an attempt to present an accurate picture of everyday life in modern China.
